at 5 pm carried away the spanker Seft

to it bent the sail and set it Keefed at 6
took in the fore topsail

Dec 31 All of these 24 hours Strong Gales from the WSW
with Rain saw nothing at 1 pm took in the
fore top sail at 7 pm clear weather

Jan 1 The first part of these 24 hours moderate clear

the latter part fresh breezes from the NW
steered NW by S with light showers and cloudy
weather

from the north at daylight saw a ship Bound

the north at 8 am close reefed the main topsail
at 11 the wind hauled the NW tacked ship
at 4 pm moderate set the fore sail at 7 tacked
ship to the Southward

Jan 6 The first of these 24 hours light air from the
NW with Rain saw nothing the latter
part Strong breezes from the WSW and clear
steered NW by SE at 6 pm Pumped ship find
the ship leaks in her upper works fore

Jan 7 The first part of these 24 hours Strong Gales from the
SW at 8 am took in jib and main sail the latter
part heavy Gales with Rain from the WSW at
4 pm took in fore sail and close reefed the main

Jan 8 The first part of these 24 hours moderate breezes
from the WSW steered NW by SE saw
finback and Porpoises the latter part the wind
hauled to the NW at 6 pm tacked ship
the ship know leaks 100 strokes in 24 hours
