Tuesday
March 16 All of these 24 hours strong breezes from the N.E. cloudy with showers of Rain at daylight commenced cutting at 3 PM finished cutting stove in combins of the main masts with a head

Wednesday
March 17 All of these 24 hours strong Gales and cloudy with showers of Rain Steered N.W. all employed in boiling saw finders at 12 o'clock moderate set the fore topsail and jib

Thursday
March 18 All of these 24 hours strong Gales with showers of Rain from the N.E. Steered N.W. by W. at 11 o'clock last night finished boiling all employed cleaning ship and other duty saw nothing

Obs Lat 11. 36 N

Friday
March 19 All of these 24 hours moderate trades and cloudy Steered N.W. all employed in ship duty nothing to be seen this day so ends

Obs Lat 13. 38 N

Saturday
March 20 All of these 24 hours strong trades and clear weather Steered N.W. by W. all employed in ship duty saw nothing events

Obs Lat 15. 46 N

Sunday
March 21 All of these 24 hours strong Gales and cloudy with showers of Rain Steered N.W. all employed in ship duty saw nothing this day so ends

Monday
March 22 All of these 24 hours strong trades and cloudy with Rain Steered N.W. by N all employed in ship duty saw nothing

Tuesday
March 23 All of these 24 hours strong Gales from the N.E. Steered N.W. by N all employed in ship duty at sundown saw Awoyhee bearing W.S.W. dist 16 leagues

Wednesday
March 24 The greater part of these 24 hours fresh trades at daylight Steered W.S.W. at daylight saw Nowee bearing W.S.W. dist 7 leagues all employed in bending Chances and getting the anchors off the boat at 8 PM came to an anchor at Nowee harbour in 15 fathoms of water the Superior of New London is here with 120 bls of oil

Thursday
March 25 At daylight commenced and employed in getting out water cask for water and stowing down oil stowed down 12 bls. at sun down got 305 bls of Cask on shore and filled up

Friday
March 26 All of these 24 hours strong trades at 8 AM sent half of the crew on Liberty the rest employed in setting up shooks and other ship duty at sundown all hands on board

Saturday
March 27 All of these 24 hours strong Gales from the N.E. at 10 AM got a Raft of Water on board and sent half of the crew on shore at 4 PM let go the Starboard anchor

Sunday
March 28 All of these 24 hours light air and calms with Showers Rain at 8 AM half of the crew went on shore the rest looking out for the ship at daylight hove the Starboard anchor up to the bow

Monday
March 29 All of these 24 hours fair weather at 8 AM half of the crew went on shore the rest employed in blacking lands and stowing water at 9 AM got off 6 bls of Potatoes at 4 PM got off 20 Tunks at 10 AM the Milton of New Bedford came in 16 months out 800 bls of oil Spence Capt Tuckerman

Tuesday
March 30 The first part of these 24 hours fine weather at daylight sent for a Raft of Water at 8 AM took the Water on board and sent half of the crew on shore the rest employed in stowing Water and blacking lands at 10 sent one thousand feet of boards on shore the latter part squally

Wednesday
March 31 All of these 24 hours fine weather at daylight sent and got a Raft of Water at 9 half of the crew went on shore sent 400 feet of board and 120 bls of oil and got off 10 bls of yams and 30 Tunks and stowing down water
