Monday April 19th All of these 24 hours fresh breezes from the N.E. with clear weather at 8 am bent a new spanker and main topsail, at 1 Pm unbent the jib and bent another unbent the flying jib and bent in the boom nothing to be seen this day steered N.W. at Sundown took in sail

Tuesday April 20th All of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the N.W. steered N.W. all employed in mending sail saw a great number of finbacks at 5 pm saw Right Whale lowered 3 Boats struck and hauled the iron came on board and took in sail a large swell from the East

Saturday April 24th The first of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the N.W. made all sail. with clear weather all employed in ship duty saw a number of finbacks at 5 pm the hauled to N.W. with a fresh Gale with Rain taken sail and layed the ship two headed to Westward

Sunday April 25th This day Commences and ends with moderate clear weather at 8 AM tacked ship and Stoyed to N and E wind North at 3 pm tacked ship again saw Porpoises at Sundown took in sail ends this day
