Friday June 18 All of these 24 hours light air and calm from the S.E. with cloudy weather at 9 am saw Whales. all employed ship duty and mending boats at sundown took in sail
 Lat 51. 03 N

Saturday June 19 Light air and calm all of these 24 hours all employed in ship duty and mending boats saw a ship boiling and saw Whales

Sunday June 20 All of these 24 hours light breeze from the Eastward with fog at 7 am saw Whales lowered and got a Whale with the waist boat at 11 took him alongside and cut him in at 8 pm finished cutting and commenced boiling

Monday June 21 All of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the South and East with fog all employed in stowing away bone and getting out water at daylight stopped boiling (a dry skin) saw Grampse

Tuesday June 22 All of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the East with fog at 11 saw Whales lowered got a Whale at 1 pm took him alongside and commenced cutting at 7 pm saw cutting and set watch the watch employed in throwing the whale in the hatchway overboard

Wednesday June 23 All of these 24 hours strong breezes from the East with fog employed in cutting and boiling at 1 pm finished cutting saw Whales bound to Northward

Thursday June 24 All of these 24 hours strong breezes from the South and East employed in boiling and stowing down oil. saw Whales. This day ends with foggy weather
 Lat 53. 02 N

Friday June 25 The first part strong Gales with Rain from the N.E. employed in boiling and stowing down oil at Pm finished boiling the latter part moderate breezes and clear from the S.E.
 Lat 52. 50 N

Saturday June 26 Light air and clear all of these 24 hours all employed in stowing down oil and mending boats saw humpbacks at Sundown took in sail
 Lat 53. 02 North

Sunday June 27 The first part of these 24 hours fine weather saw humpbacks at 9 am spoke the ship Sapphire of Salem 19 months out 1100 lbs of oil. the latter part strong Gales from the S.W. with fog at Sundown took in sail
 Lat 53. 20 N

Monday June 28 All of these 24 hours strong breezes from the West. Stopped off East. at 8 am saw Whales in company with the Sapphire lowered 2 boats got no whale. all employed in starting fresh water at Sundown took in sail
 Lat 53. 30 North

Tuesday June 29 All of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the West at 6 Am saw Whales lowered chased them did not strike at 10 spoke the ship Ella of Rockport 12 months out 900 lbs of oil at 2 Pm saw more Whales lowered got no whale at Sundown took in sail sold the Ella 2 coils of whale line
 Lat 54. 33 N

Wednesday June 30 All of these 24 hours strong Gales from the West with Rain and fog a saw Whales all employed in stowing off between decks at 8 pm took in the fore sail and took the boats up
 Lat 54. 33 N
