Wednesday July 14 All of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the N.W. with clear weather. Saw Whales lowered and Chased but not strike all employed ship duty.

Lat 55.40 N

Thursday July 15 All of these 24 hours calms saw nothing all employed in stowing bone and setting up Shooks and stowing Trest in the Run at sundown took in Sail

Friday July 16

All of these 24 hours fine weather and light breezes from the North at 5 am saw Whales. lowered struck and killed one at 1 Pm took him along side one man hurt by him at 9 finished cutting saw more Whales

Saturday July 17 All of these 24 hours fine clear weather with the wind from the North and N.W. at daylight saw Whales at 8 am lowered and Chased all day struck one and parted from him so near

Sunday July 18 All of these 24 hours Strong Gales from the N.W. all employed in boiling. Saw no Whales at 5 pm spoke the Ship India of New Bedford 12 months 1500 bls of oil at 11 pm finished boiling.

Lat 55.42 N

Monday July 19

The first part Strong Gales from the N.W. saw Whales all day all employed in stowing saw oil between decks at 5 Pm finished stowing and lowered and struck an Whale at 8 cut from him the latter part Strong Gales from the S.E. with rain so near

Tuesday July 20

All of these 24 hours Strong Gales from the S.W. with fog and Rain all employed in stowing bone saw finbacks and a Ship to the windward

Lat 55.21 N

Wednesday July 21

All of these 24 hours Strong Gales from the S.W. with fog all employed in stowing down oil. Saw Right Whales and finbacks going to the N.E.

Lat 55.50 N

Thursday July 22

All of these 24 hours Strong Gales from the S.E. with fog and Rain saw Whales did not lower saw a Ship to the windward at sundown took in Sail

Lat 55.10 N

Friday July 23

All of these 24 hours Strong Gales from the S.E. with fog and Rain nothing to be seen this day at 10 am took in the jib and Left top sail so ends

Lat 55.50 N

Saturday July 24

All of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the S.E. with thick fog saw nothing all employed ship duty at 5 pm mended all sail and steered to the Southward so ends

Lat 55.11 N

Sunday July 25

All of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the S.E. with light fog steered S.E. by S. saw Right Whales and finbacks the Ship Leek is about 500 strds in 24 hours
