Saturday August 11 All of these 24 hours strong Gale from S.S.W. to South with Showers of Rain all employed in mending, sail at 8 Pm bent a new Gaff topsail the Ships Leek is about 75 strokes an hour Nothing to be seen this day

Sunday August 12 The first part of these 24 hours strong Gale and cloudy from the S.S.W. saw Porpoise at 1 Pm noon took in jib and mainsail the latter moderate breeze from the N.W. with Rain and fog seen

Monday August 13 The first part of these 24 hours light breeze from the N.W. with Rain steered by W. saw Grampusses and blackfish the latter part light breeze from the N.E. with fog and Rain steered S.S.W. the Ships Leek is open smooth about 20 strokes an hour

Tuesday August 14 All of these 24 hours moderate breeze from the westward with clear weather steered S.S.W. employed in Ship duty at 9 pm sent out the flying jib boom saw Porpoise

Wednesday August 15 All of these 24 hours strong breeze from the North and cloudy steered S.S.W. saw Porpoise all employed in Ship duty

Lat 34. 25 N

Thursday August 16 All of these 24 hours strong Gale from the N.E. and clear steered S.S.W. at 4 am bent the flying jib at 1 Pm took in the main sail and Reel'd the topsails nothing to be seen this day

Lat 32. 19 N

Friday August 13 All of these 24 hours strong breeze from the N.E. and squally weather steered S.S.W. all employed in Ship duty Nothing to be seen this 24 hours

Lat 30. 26 N

Saturday August 14 The first part of these 24 hours fresh breeze from the N.E. with Showers of Rain steered S.S.W. the latter part moderate and clear wind N.W. steered by W. employed in Ship duty Nothing to be seen this day

Lat 28. 33 N

Sunday August 15 All of these 24 hours light breeze from S.E. to South and cloudy with Showers of Rain steered S.S.W. saw Porpoise and jumbies

Lat 27. 21 N

Monday August 16 All of these 24 hours fine moderate breeze from East to S.E. and clear steered S.S.W. employed in Ship duty saw Porpoise

Lat 25. 09 N

Tuesday August 17 All of these 24 hours strong breeze from the N.E. steered S.S.W. employed in sending Royal mast and yards at 3 Pm saw sperm Whales lowered 4 boats struck and killed 8 Whales and saved 4. at 9 Pm took them along side

Lat 24. 00 N

Wednesday August 18 All of these 24 hours strong Gale from N.E. with a heavy swell at day break commenced cutting at 4 Pm finished and cleared away Nothing to be seen this day
