Thursday August 19 All of these 24 hours moderate breezes from the E.N.E. and clear weather all employed in boiling ~~the~~ furs

Lat 23-28 N

Friday August 20 All of these 24 hours fine moderate breezes the E.N.E. Steered S.W. by E at daylight finished boiling at 1 P.M. bent a new fore sail and spanker and sent up the fore Royal mast saw fourbacks

Lat 22-27 N

Saturday August 21 All of these 24 hours light breezes from N.E. and clear Steered S.W. by W all employed in taring rigging and painting at 3 P.M. bent a new main sail at 11 A.M. saw Wyhee and Nowee at sundown bearing S.W. dist 15 leagues Wyhee bearing South

Lat 21-22 N

Sunday August 22 All of these 24 hours strong trades Steered S.W. at daylight saw Nowee bearing N.W. Steered in all day at 5 P.M. anchored of the foot in 15 fathoms of water and furled the sails, vessels the Milton of New Bedford is here with 2000 bl. of oil 22 months

Monday August 23 All of these 24 hours fine clear weather All employed in stowing down oil and getting off Recruits 3 Boys 20 turkeys and 12 ducks at sundown Pump Ship found her perfectly tight in her bottom to ends

Tuesday August 24 All of these 24 hours light air from the Southward at 3 P.M. took our anchor and made all sail and Steered for Washoe at midnight strong trades Steered N.W.

Barque Beaver of Hudson at Washoe 1841

Wednesday August 25 At daylight came to anchor at Washoe back of the bar in 18 fathoms of water strong trades all of these 24 hours all employed in cleaning ship

Thursday August 26 All of these 24 hours strong trades at daylight the Pilot came off to take the ship on side but could not on account of strong winds and went on shore again

Friday August 27 At daylight took our anchor and came in side in 24 fathoms of water all employed in getting water to heel the ship with and washing decks

Saturday August 28 At 8 A.M. one half of the crew went on shore the others employed in painting and cleaning ship

Sunday August 29 ~~One half of the crew of shore and the others employed in painting and cleaning ship the Captains came 4 in number to work the ship~~

Sunday August 29 fine clear weather all on shore to Church at sundown got in a row with the natives

Monday August 30 One half of the crew on shore the others employed in spinning down at 6 A.M. the Captains came 5 in number to work the ship at 4 P.M. discharged the Kanakas
