

Barge Beaver of Hudson 1841

Friday
Oct 29 All of these 24 hours strong breezes from the South at daylight saw Ennis all employed in ship duty at 4 Pm spoke the ship Statania of Newtucket 23 months 2250 of sperm oil Capt Folger at sundown Ennis bearing South dist 5 leagues double. Reefed the topsail and steered N.W. by W.

Saturday
Oct 30 All of these 24 hours fine clear weather with light breezes from the Eastward at daylight saw Hecla bearing ahead at 9 Pm took a Pilot at 12 let go the anchor in 19 fathoms of water.

Sunday
Oct 31 The first part of these 24 hours fine clear weather at 8 A.M. sent all hands on shore the latter part Rainy squally weather.

Nov
Monday 1 The greater part of these 24 hours Rainy squally weather at 8 A.M. sent 2 Boats around the Island to trade the others employed in getting water.

Tuesday
Nov 2 Rainy squally weather all of these 24 hours all employed in coaling oil and stowing water and blacking beads.

Wednesday
Nov 3 All of these 24 hours fine clear weather at 8 A.M. sent half of the crew on shore the others employed in blacking beads and other duty.

Thursday
Nov 4 The first part of these 24 hours thick Rainy weather the middle part fair at daylight sent a Boat Round the Island for Potatoes the latter part Rainy squally weather.

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Friday
Nov 5 The first part of these 24 hours light breezes from the Southward at 8 A.M. sent one Boat after Potatoes the middle and latter part clear weather at 9 Pm took a Pilot and went to sea all employed in stowing away the cables and anchors at sundown Hecla bearing N.E. dist 5 leagues.

Saturday
Nov 6 All of these 24 hours strong breeze from the S.E. with cloudy Rainy weather all employed in ship duty. Nothing seen to day.

Sunday
Nov 7 The first part light air from S.E. and cloudy with Showers of Rain saw Porpoise the latter part clear weather with a moderate breeze from the East.

Lat 19. 09 South

Monday
Nov 8 The first part of these 24 hours light moderate weather and cloudy all employed in mending sails. Nothing seen to day the latter part squally Rainy weather.

Lat 20. 50 S

Tuesday
Nov 9 The first part moderate breezes from the S.E. at 8 A.M. saw land Remittan an island bearing South dist 25 miles the latter part fair weather all employed in mending sail at sundown the land bearing South.

Lat 22. 02 South

Wednesday
Nov 10 All of these 24 hours strong breezes from the S.E. Steered East all employed in mending sail. Nothing seen to day.
