Sunday Nov 14 All of these 24 hours strong breezes from the East Steered South Nothing seen to day

Monday Nov 15 All of these 24 hours strong breezes from the E. S. E. Steered South all employed in ship duty Nothing seen to day

Lat 28.28 S

Tuesday Nov 16 All of these 24 hours strong breezes from the E. S. E. Steered South all employed in mending and making sail saw Porpoise

Lat 30.30 South

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Wednesday Nov 17 All of these 24 hours strong breezes from the E. S. E. Steered to southward cloudy weather all employed in mending sail at 9 Am bent a new maintop gallant sail Nothing seen to day

Lat 33.05

Thursday Nov 18 All of these 24 hours strong Gales from the E. S. E. and cloudy weather all employed in altering and maintop sail saw finbacks and Porpoise

Lat 35.18 South

Friday Nov 19 All of these 24 hours strong Gales and cloudy from the E. S. E. Steered S. W. at 9 Am commenced wetting the oil to stop it from leaking Nothing seen to day

Lat 37.18 South

Saturday Nov 20 The Greater part of these 24 hours strong Gales from E. S. E. all employed in mending sail at 3 pm bent a mainsail and shanked at 6 pm double reefed the maintop sail and took in mainsail the point squally weather Nothing seen to day

Lat 39.03 S

Sunday Nov 21 All of these 24 hours strong and squally weather wind from the E. S. E. Steered E by N at 9 am took in jib and fore top sail at 2 pm took in fore sail and reefed the Hensen

Monday Nov 22 The Greater part of these 24 hours foggy weather with moderate breezes from the N. E. Steered E by N all employed in wetting hole the latter part I employed in Reeking new top sail braces and bent topmast standing sail at set it
