

Ship Swift Outward bound
Monday July 28 1849

Begins with light breeze from N.W. then
N.E. and the land bearing N.N.W. sail
in sight to windward at 7 P.M. hald to
S.E. and took in light sails for the night
the middle a fine breeze from N.N.W. the
latter part the same and steering E.
Saw one ship steering E. S. end
the weather thick Lat 39.55 N Long 29.00 W

Tuesday July 29th

Begins with fresh breeze from N.W.
and thick weather & steering E. at 7 P.M.
shortened sail for the night and left
to the wind N.E. at 12. Rose ship to the
Westward at 4 A.M. put away the weather
thick & small Lat 39.40 N Long 29.48 W

Wednesday July 30th

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.
steering S. at 4 past 5 P.M. saw
the Island of St. George bearing S.
Dist 15 miles at 7 Hald of short sails
short sail heading E. S. at 12. rose
ship to the N.W. the weather thick at
7. at 10 steering N.W. the wind N.E.
& the Island of St. George in sight
at midday. Fayall & Pica in sight
& small Lat 39.16 N Long 28.24 W

Thursday July 31st

Begins with fresh winds from N.E.
and a heavy swell on and steering W.N.W.
under short sail Fayall bearing N.W.
at 7 P.M. left to of shore heading N.W.
at 12. took ship to the S.E. the latter
part close in to Fayall harbour &
small one whales in the land
& small Lat Long

Ship Swift Outward bound
Friday July 31st

Begins with calm weather and
standing in through the Passay
at 1 P.M. lowered a boat and went
in and at 8. came off with the
reduced & so farth and 8. saw
Portugal and steering S.W. through
the Passage at 10 N.W. took a light
breeze from W. and work out to the
South the latter part the same and
and hald employed about the regin
& small Lat 38.55 N Long 38.59

Saturday July 1st 1850

Begins with a light breeze from
N.W. and work of shore at 3 P.M.
saw a ship & sailing to windward
and we heading S.W. by the prime
at 10 P.M. that ship to the N. heading
N.W. the latter part calm and heading
of shore Lat 38.16 N Long 38.40 W

Sunday July 2nd

Begins with a light breeze from
N.W. and heading S.W. at 8
P.M. took ship to the North and the
West end of Fayall bearing N.E. by N. by
compass one mile in sight and a
steamer bound to Fayall, the middle
part a fine breeze and the land
under our lee latter part land out
of sight. Lat 39.23 N Long 39.17 W

Monday July 3rd

Begins with a fine breeze from N.W.
steering N.E. with all sail set at 7
P.M. took in the Fore & Mizzen. Fayall
sail the middle and latter part a fresh
breeze from W. and steering N.W. and
saw nothing of note Lat 41.13 N
Long 30.08 W
