of 10 miles Lat 43.42 N Long 31.10 W

Sunday Aug 12th

Begins with fine weather and at 5 P.M.
the case in and and a plenty of
whales in sight the wind S.W. and
with fair at 11 finished hauling the
head and got 6 A.M. come hauling and
at 7 were ship to the Westward
the wind S.W. so much then 24 hours
one bark post close to Lat 44.04 N Long 31.07 W

Monday Aug 13th

Begins with fresh winds from S.W.
and heading to the Westward and
hauling at 2 A.M. it came raining at 10
Lat in a heavy rain and finished the
head and could derive 10 miles more
Ship to the South Lat 44.20 N Long 31.30 W

Tuesday Aug 14th

Begins with strong winds from N.E.
and heading S. and raining hard at
3 P.M. held up and at 4 came hauling
again the middle part fair at 3 A.M.
it began to rain the latter part raining
and hauling 2 one sail in sight
steering N.W. so much then 24
hours Lat 44.30 N Long 31.40 W

Ship Sloop outward bound
Wednesday Aug 15th

Begins with thick weather and
calm & sailing one ship in sight
the middle part a light breeze from E.
& steering S. at 5 A.M. finished hauling
& made sail to get to the South at 9 A.M.
exchange signals with an English
Bray so much Lat 44.48 N Long 31.43 W

Thursday Aug 16th

Begins with a light breeze from E.
& steering S.W. at 7 P.M. took in the
fit & main top gallant sail for the night
the middle & latter part calm and saw
nothing Lat 44.19 N Long 31.45 W

Friday Aug 17th

Begins with a light breeze from S.W.
& heading W. at 7 P.M. took light sail
for the night the middle and latter part
fine weather & heading S.W. and saw
9 sail to day Lat 43.59 N Long 31.30 W

Lucas 32nd 1/2

Saturday Aug 18th

Begins with a fine breeze from S.E.
and heading S.W. and no whales to
be seen but a plenty of birds at 7 P.M.
took in sail for the night the middle
part fair and at 5 A.M. took ship to
the Eastward and employed a party
the oil to stow between decks so much
saw black fish Lat 43.09 N Long 32.50 W

Sunday Aug 19th

Begins with a fine breeze from the
S. and heading E.S.E. at 8 P.M. started
sail for the night & at 2 P.M. put down
85 lbs of oil below decks the middle &
latter part fine weather and saw nothing
of note Lat 43.38 N Long 31.50 W
