

Ship Swift Outward bound
Monday Aug 27
Begins with a fine breeze from S.
and heading N.E. at 7 P.M. took
in Light sails the middle and later
part fine and nothing of note to
be seen Lat 42° 59' N Long 32° 27' W.
Tuesday Aug 28

Begins with a light breeze from the South
& heading N.E. at 7 P.M. took in sail
for the night & wore ship to the Eastward
the middle a fresh breeze from S.W. &
heading S.E. at 4 A.M. saw three whales
to the south of the weather bore & hauled out
& came to windward quick & hauled out
set up with them & ended with a
sherry breeze Lat 42° 55' N Long 31° 30' W.
Wednesday Aug 29

Begins with a strong breeze from S.W. and
heading S.E. at 1 P.M. took ship in
light to fall in with the whales and
at 4 it blowing on soft down at 5
took in fore & main topsail & hove to
it blowing a gale from N.E. W. and
heavy rain & wore ship to the South
at 9 P.M. wind held to the Northward
blowing a gale the latter part the
sun & hove to Lat 42° 44' N Long 32° 20' W.
Thursday Aug 30

Begins with a gale from N.N.E. heading
N.W. at 4 P.M. the gale abated some &
wore ship to the Eastward the middle
part more moderate latter part fine &
heading E. Lat 42° 44' N Long 31° 40' W.
Friday Aug 31

Begins with a light breeze from the North
heading E. at 7 the wind held to N.W.
& Lupton & took in sail for the night
the latter part blowing sherry from
N.W. & heading S. Lat 42° 54' N Long 30° 44' W.

Ship Swift Outward bound
Saturday Sept 1st
Begins with heavy winds from N.N.
W. and steering S. at 4 P.M. Lupton to
the Westward at 8 A.M. took to the East
wind N. and the weather fair and
saw nothing Lat 42° 15' N Long 30° 35' W.
Sunday Sept 2nd

Begins with a fine breeze from N.
N.E. and heading E. & one sail in
sight at 4 P.M. saw one hump back
whale at 4 past 8 took ship to the
North West the latter part steering N.
the wind E. and very light and saw
nothing Lat 42° 50' N Long 30° 30' W.
Monday Sept 3rd

Begins with light airs from E.S.E. and
steering N. and saw Grampian one
sail only at 7 took in sail for the night
the latter part fine weather and steering
N.W. & saw nothing of note but vessel
a plenty of them Lat 43° 52' N Long 31° 45' W.
Tuesday Sept 4th

Begins with a fine breeze from S.E. W.
and steering to the Westward and
spoke an English bark steering E.
at 7 P.M. took ship to the Eastward
the middle blowing on strong and
at 8 A.M. took in fore and main
topsail it blowing a gale from S.E. W.
& small Lat 42° 56' N Long 31° 20' W.
Wednesday Sept 5th

Begins with a gale from S.E. W. and
hove to heading S.E. at 1 P.M. Close
up the main topsail and took in the
fore sail it blowing very heavy
out & took up the lee boat the middle
part a very heavy sea on and the
got adrift between decks and stove
one of the boards Lat 43° 11' Long 31° 00' W.
