

Ship Swift outward bound
Wednesday Sept the 13th
Begins with a gale from N.E. and
Stirling N.E. under close reef Main
Topsail & double reef Fore & Foremast
at 3 P.M. the gale increasing & took
in the Fore Topsail & at 4 past 5
took in Foremast & left to heading
E. by S. a bad sea in the middle part
the same latter part the gale
abated some and heading E. & S.
so ended Lat 42.23 N Long 29.35 W

Thursday Sept the 14th
Begins with a gale from N.E. and
Stirling to heading E. & S. at 2 P.M.
it abated so that we set the Fore Sail
at 10 night set Fore and Main Topsail
latter part Main Topmast Sail Out
& Stirling. Second half to E. & S. E.
so ended Lat 41.09 N Long 28.44 W

Friday Sept the 15th
Begins with a fresh breeze from
E. & S. E. Stirling Port & past a
small in Main Sail & 1/2 double
reef the Topsails the weather looking
heavy the middle part moderate and
Stirling. Second half set sail at 5
A.M. put all sail on and Stirling S.W.
and employed a fitting the oil so ended
these 24 hours Lat 39.31 N Long 28.30 W

Saturday Sept the 16th
Begins with a fine breeze from E. and
Stirling S.W. at 3 P.M. made the
Island of Fayall and 300 bars of S.W.
& S. by E. at 6 P.M. finished
topping the oil the middle part
of wind on the land at 8 A.M.
stood in to Fayall at 10 found a boat
and went on shore

to day we have the 13th day

Wednesday Sept the 14th
Begins with fine weather wind at Lying
of wind on Fayall at P.M. a boat
came off and took in our oil at 7
the boat came off and we stood
out to the S.W. wind E. the latter
part calm and of 20 miles from
the Land Lat 38.14 N Long 28.46 W

Thursday Sept the 15th
Begins with light air from the
Wind heading to the N. & W. at
3 P.M. a boat came from the shore
and at 6 P.M. stood on towards
the off point of Fayall the latter
part a light breeze from S. E. and
of the W. end of Fayall so ended
these 24 hours Lat 38.34 N Long 28.51 W

Friday Sept the 16th
Begins with strong light air
from S. E. and standing in for
the Land & a number of vessels in
sight at 12 at night a boat came off
from the shore and brought 50 bushels
of Potatoes & at 3 A.M. the coast on
shore & we stood off the latter part
a fresh breeze from E. & S. and Stirling
to the S.W. Lat 38.37 N Long 28.59 W

Saturday Sept the 17th
Begins with a fresh breeze from E. & S. E.
about 1 P.M. held on the wind
to the S. at 5 P.M. thick & raining upon
Fayall lying N. E. 30 miles West the
middle part a fine breeze at 12 the wind
held to the W. and Stirling S. E. so ended
with fine weather but a bad sea
on & fine in sight lying N. W. distant
Lat 37.24 N Long 28.18 W
