

Ship kept on the coast of New Zealand
Wednesday March 11th 1850
Begins with a strong breeze from
N.E. and squally at 3 P.M. blowing
to a gale and took in fore Mizzen &
Sail & Jib heading N.N.W. at 5
noon ship & took in foresail it
being rainy the middle & latter part
a heavy rain & light air & heading
from E to S. Lat 33.00 S. Long 178.50 E

Thursday March 12th 1850
Begins with a strong breeze from
N.E. and thick weather at 1 P.M. set
fore sail & spinnaker at 3 P.M. it
blowing strong took them in for the
night, the middle & latter part a
thick fog & calm Lat 33.17 S. Long 178.50 E

Friday March 13th 1850
Begins with a calm and foggy at
2 P.M. a light air sprang up from S.W.
and set fore & main topsail during
N.N.E. the middle part calm. Latter
a breeze from N.N.E. and heading E
the weather thick & rainy & saw nothing
so could Lat 33.30 S. Long 178.55 E

Saturday March 14th 1850
Begins with a breeze from N.N.E.
and thick weather and heading E
at 3 P.M. took in main sail & Jib for
the night the latter part a strong breeze
from N.E. & thick Lat 33.50 S. Long 179.00 E

Sunday March 15th 1850
Begins with a strong breeze from N and
lost ship to the N.W. at 3 P.M. became
rainy & took in sail heading N.W.
the middle and latter part a fresh
breeze so could Lat 33.25 S. Long 179.48 E

New Zealand
Monday March 11th 1850
Begins with thick weather and breeze from N.
by E and heading E by N. at 8 P.M.
lost ship to the N.W. and shortened sail
for the night the latter part a light
breeze from N.N.W. heading N.E.
so could Lat 33.00 S. Long 179.00 E

Tuesday March 12th 1850
Begins with a light breeze from N.W.
at 3 P.M. took a fresh breeze from S.
& steering N.N.E. at 5 took in sail for
the night the latter part sail on and
steering N.N.E. with a strong breeze from
S.E. and thick weather Lat 31.32 S. Long 179.53 E

Wednesday March 13th 1850
Begins with a strong breeze from S.E.
and steering N.W. at 1 P.M. kept
the topsail on at 5 took in fore & main
top sail & left to the wind N.E. the
weather very thick the middle and latter
part the same and steering of S.E.
and S.E. Lat 30.35 S. Long 178.25 E

Thursday March 14th 1850
Begins with a strong wind from S.E.
and squally weather & steering of N.E. over
the ground and no whales at 3 P.M. left
to and shortened sail for the night the
middle part a gale wind haled to S.
latter part main top sail in and heading
W.S.W. Lat 29.55 S. Long 178.12 E

Friday March 15th 1850
Begins with a gale from S. and line
to anchor & spinnaker & fore topmast staysail
it blowing heavy at 10 it moderated and
set main topsail the latter part set
fore & main top sail & Jib steering to
the eastward and looking for whales
but found none Lat 29.46 S. Long 178.30 E
