

Ship Left of N.W. from Sunday
Thursday May 9th 1850
Begins with squally weather and steering
down the main. Hatching at 8 P.M.
Hapt for the night at 8 A.M. Come
so ends the weather squally and saw
nothing of note Lat 27.08 S. Long 179.45

Friday May 10th
Begins with squally and steering
down at 4 past 8 Hatching the middle
& latter part squally and steering. Strong
and heading E. S. E. Lat 27.50 S. Long 179.15

Saturday May 11th
Begins with a gale from N.N.E. and
heading E. at 6 P.M. every ship to the
N.W. and under short sail the latter
part sail on steering to the Westward at
10 A.M. saw whale lower and struck
one and at Meridian took his along
side and wind from E. S. E.
and squally Lat 28.06 S. Long 179.30

Sunday May 12th
Begins with squally weather wind from
E. S. E. at 2 P.M. Come cutting and it here
rugged at 5 the wind held to N. and
at 8 got the body in and the weather
squally and lying by the head at 9 past
1 A.M. had a very heavy squall from
E.N.E. and cut all chains to take in
sail and lower to rats & separate at 8
the gale abated some and took in the
head at 10 Corn boiling and the wind very
light Lat 28.10 S. Long 179.52 E

Monday May 13th
Begins with a light rain from the N.
and heavy swell on & in place a boiling
the latter part fine weather and boiling
Wind S. and steering to the Eastward and
saw nothing Lat 28.24 S. Long 179.58 E

Tuesday May 14th 1850
Begins with fine weather and wind from
S. steering over the ground at 5 A.M.
fine weather boiling at 8 took in sail for
the night at 8 P.M. Made sail &
steering E. and 10 steering E by N. at
Meridian saw a whale and held
the head. Hapt about 10 ends there
24 hours Lat 27.45 S. Long 179.00 W

Wednesday May 15th
Begins with strong breeze from S.W.
at 4 past Meridian lower for a large
whale at 4 past 3 struck and at
4 past 4 took him along side and put
the other side oil down between
deck and so forth
at 8 A.M. Come cutting the weather
squally and a bad squall from at
11 got the head of so ends there
24 hours Lat 27.25 S. Long 179.00 W

Thursday May 16th
Begins with a strong breeze from
S.W. & rain and cutting at 4 P.M.
got the body in and at 8 Corn
boiling and lying by the head the
latter part took in the head and weather
squally & boiling the body so ends
here 24 hours Lat 27.06 S. Long 178.28 W

Friday May 17th
Begins with a strong breeze and boiling
heading to the S.E. at 5 P.M. every
ship to the Westward the latter part
fine weather and boiling and saw
nothing of note Lat 27.06 S.
Long 179.00 W
