

Ship Swift Cruise
Tuesday May 28th 1850
Begins with a heavy Gale from
the North and going to heading
E. N. E. under Fore & aft sails the
middle part wind held to W. and
Moulded down and set Main Topsail
the latter part a strong wind and
high sea Lat 27.07 S Long 179.06 W

Wednesday May 29th
Begins with a Gale from W. and
going to wind at work on Storm
boat at 5 P.M. were ship to the
South the latter part fair weather
wind from S. S. W. and heading W
to the S. E. Lat 27.23 S Long 178.30

Thursday May 30th
Begins with a light breeze from the
S. and heading to the S. E. at 6 P.M.
were ship to the W. the middle part
latter part Calm and saw nothing
of note Lat 27.17 S Long 178.24 W

Friday May 31st
Begins with Calm weather and a
thine to get to the Westward the middle
part a light air from E. and heading
S. W. the latter part a fine breeze and
steering to the S. W. and saw one
fin back Lat 27.30 S Long 178.45 W

Saturday June 1st
Begins with squally weather and wind
from N. E. to N. and steering to the
S. W. at 6 P.M. took in sail for the
night the latter part a fresh breeze
E. N. E. and steering of to the Westward
and impley a Starboard broadside
Piped so cold and no whaled
Lat 27.32 S Long 179.41 W

N. W. from Sunday Island
Sunday June 2nd 1850
Begins with a strong breeze from
S. N. E. and heading S. E. and saw
nothing of note the middle and
latter part a Gale from N. E. and at
10 P.M. took in Main Topsail heading
to the S. E. Lat 28.17 S Long 179.50 W

Monday June 3rd
Begins with a Gale from N. E. and
heading S. E. & under Fore & aft
sail at 2 P.M. wind N. N. E. thick.
I took up the Starboard Boat the
middle blowing heavy and a heavy
squall and a great deal of rain
at 4 P.M. wind held to N. N. W.
abated some and set Main Topsail &
Jacksail the latter part Clear and
southerly up the sails on 2 Main sail
& 1st top heading N. N. E. so much
and a head down Lat 28.34 S Long 179.22 W
Sun - 179.25 W

Tuesday June 4th
Begins with a strong breeze from
W. N. W. and heading N. at 1 P.M.
took in sail for the night the latter
part impley a moderate breeze top
sail and the weather fair and
saw nothing Lat 29.36 S Long 179.05 W

Wednesday June 5th
Begins with strong breezes from
W. N. W. and heading over
the ground at 1 P.M. saw fin back
but no sp. whale the latter part a
strong breeze from W. and heading to the
S. at Meridian fact so much the weather
very squally Lat 29.24 S Long 178.18 W
