

Ship Swift & N. W. from Sunday
Thursday June 6th 1850
Begins with strong winds from W.
& S. W. at 3 P.M. blowing to a
Gale & took in J. & Mizen Top sail
and at 4 took in Fore sail & then ran
the main & sail and were ship to the
North at 5 took up Starboard Boat
the middle part wind hauled to S. W.
and a high sea on the latter part making
strong & small Lat 24° 01' S. Long 178° 00' W.

Friday June 7th
Begins with a Gale from S. W. and
blowing to heading W. N. W. at 4 P.M.
took the Fore sail and the Gale abating
some but a heavy swell on the middle
part blowing strong at 4 P.M. made
sail and steering off N. E. the weather
very squally Lat 26° 12' S. Long 177° 19' W.
in June 177° 26' W.

Saturday June 8th
Begins with a Gale from W. N. W. and
steering N. E. and at 5 P.M.
took in J. & Mizen Top sail & Fore sail and were
to heading to the North and at 8
took in main Top sail the latter part
more moderate and made sail and steering
from S. E. Lat 25° 32' S. Long 176° 18' W.

Sunday June 9th
Begins with a breeze from W. N. W. and
steering N. E. and at 4 past 4 P.M. saw
a Spout of the Lee Bow and run for it
but night came on and did not ascertain
what it was and were ship and took
in sail for the night at 10 were ship to the
North the latter part steering N. E. by N.
and all sail set and weather fair and
saw nothing Lat 25° 02' S. Long 175° 28' W.

Ship Swift Bound to the North
Monday June 10th 1850
Begins with fine breeze from N. W. and
clear weather and heading N. E. & E.
at 4 past 5 P.M. took in sail and were
ship to be South at 12 were ship to the
North latter part a strong breeze from S. W.
and steering off to the N. E. and saw
nothing of note Lat 26° 29' S. Long 175° 05' W.

Tuesday June 11th
Begins with fresh gales from S. W.
and steering over the ground to the N. E.
at 4 P.M. saw one hump Back whale
at 5 took in sail and left to the
N. W. for the night the latter part
fine weather and wind S. W. and steering
to the E. S. E. Lat 24° 07' S. Long 176° 28' W.

Wednesday June 12th
Begins with a fine breeze from S. W.
and steering to the N. E. and saw
nothing but finbacks at 8 P.M. shortened
sail for the night and steering S. W.
the middle part left to the wind and took
in J. & Mizen Top sail latter part fine
weather and wind S. E. and saw a plenty
of Finbacks Lat 22° 45' S. Long 175° 41' W.

Thursday June 13th
Begins with a fresh Trade from S. E. and
steering N. at 8 P.M. shortened sail for the
night the middle part under short sail
at 8 P.M. made sail and steering off N. W.
by N. at 10 saw the Wharfed of Coe Dist
50 miles bearing W. by N. E. and steering
off for the Land and saw a plenty
of finbacks and one Sp. whales
Lat 21° 37' S. Long 174° 28' W.
