

Ship Swift Cruising of Co
Friday June 14th 1850

Begins with light breeze from N.N.W.
and steering by the wind W. in for the
Land at 8th M. took in light sails
the Middle part being a S.B. of the
S.E. of the Island latter part calm and
drew in to the Land Lat 21.29 S. Long 174.30 W.

Saturday June 15th
Begins with thick weather and a light
breeze from S. to N.W. and heading in
to ward the Land at 4 P.M. were ship of
at 5 took in sail for the night and at
thick and rain at 8 Calm and the
Land bearing N.W. by compass dist
of miles the latter part close in to the
Land and toward 2 Boats at 11 and
went on shore to back and so well
there 24 hours Lat 21.15 S. Long 174.58 W.

Sunday June 16th
Begins with fine weather and begins
of an on a breeze and at 5 P.M.
breeze of wind died off and had one
man run away the Middle part
working out to the S.W. latter part
a fine breeze and standing to the Middle
and a fine Land in sight Lat 21.28 S. Long 175.37 W.

Monday June 17th
Begins with a fine breeze from the S
and heading W. S.W. of shore at 5 P.M.
sail ship to the Eastward and took in
light sail the latter part stood in to
Coira and at 10 went on shore to see
if I could get my runaway so well
lying of and on Sat

About Coira
Tuesday June 18th 1850

Begins with fine back and on shore
a trading and at 6 P.M. came off
and got the man that runaway at 8
standing out between Coira and Tongaboo
and had one man taken in on shore
set him watched to take care of him the
Middle and latter a fresh breeze and steering
E. and saw nothing Lat 21.08 S. Long 175.06 W.

Wednesday June 19th
Begins with a fresh gale from S.E.W.
and steering E. at 6 P.M. took in sail
for the night the Middle part heading
S. to. at 8 P.M. much sail and steering
S.W. N. sound Lat 21.08 S. Long 175.15 W.

Thursday June 20th
Begins with a strong breeze from S.E.W.
and steering of N.E. at 11 past 5 P.M.
took in sail & left to at 11 M. Zanzibar
and Joseph. Prato got a pickling and sent
them a letter to Samuel. Then the Middle
and latter part fine weather and steering
to the N.E. over the grain but can't
see any whale Lat 20.35 S. Long 175.40 W.

Friday June 21th
Begins with a fine trade from S.E. and
steering N.E. by S. at 1 past 5 P.M.
sail for the night and left to the Middle
part by the wind at 5 A.M. steering of N.E. by S.
latter part wind from E. and close haul
so well Lat 19.59 S. Long 176.00 W.

Saturday June 22th
Begins with a fine breeze from E. and
heading N. by E. and N.E. at 6 P.M.
much trade Island bearing N.W. & dist
36 miles at 8 took in sail and were ship
of shore the latter standing in shore a 11th M.
a number of canoes came up and fetched nothing
but shars & sepoths Lat 19.45 S. Long 176.00 W.
