Sunday June 23rd 1850

Begins with a fine breeze from E and
standing of shore to the westward at 4 post
5 shatterd sail and steering N.N.W. the
middle part held N.W. latter part wind
N.N.W. and squalls of rain and steering
N. so small saw nothing Lat 18° 45' S. Long 170° 20' W.

Monday June 24th

Begins with a light air from W.S.W.
& squally at 8 P.M. takes more
N.W. the latter part a fine trade from
S.E. and rainy. so small steering N.
by W. Lat 17° 37' S. Long 170° 13' W.

Tuesday June 25th

Begins with a fine trade from S.E. and
squalls of rain and steering N. by E. with
all sail set the latter part saw killers
and no whales and steering N.N.W.
and imployed a mizzening Main Topsail
sail Lat 15° 46' S. Long 170° 26' W.

Wednesday June 26th

Begins with a fine trade from S.E. and
steering N. by W. at 4 P.M. saw bruchus
& left for them but saw no more of them
at 8 took in the main sail & the set
at 9 saw the Island of Tortuga bearing
N.W. by N. and at 12 rose ship off
the latter part close in of the weather
and saw one canoe came of so and
then 26 passed Lat. Long

Thursday June 27th

Begins with a fresh trade and standing
in shore at 3 P.M. lowered one boat and
went in a trawling a by came of and out
of shore by the wind the middle part raining
at 8 A.M. went on shore with 2 boats in
trawling at 12 came of and stood of shore
the weather very rainy Lat Long

Friday June 28th

Begins with heavy rain and heading
off shore S.E. at 8 P.M. took in sail
for the night the middle and latter
part heavy rain and wind from S. to
E. and the land winds over so and
then 26 passed Lat 14° 59' S. Long 170° 30' W.

Saturday June 29th

Begins with a fine breeze from S.
and stood up some and run off to
land the trawling was at 8 the set
and steering off shore to the N.W. and
at 3 steering W. N.W. the weather
thick the middle part some rain and
at 11 left to heading to the eastward
at 8 A.M. we were ship and stood off
for the Island of Popo so ends with
fine weather Lat Long

Sunday June 30th

Begins with a fine breeze from the S &
steering for the harbour of Popo and saw
the Ship Herald of St. Haven was off
at 5 P.M. the pilot came up and the
wind very light and then of and on
for the night at 10 A.M. set 40 fathoms
in 5 fathoms of water and sailed

Monday July 1st 1850

Begins with a fine trade from S.E. and
going in to Popo and the Spirit of London
on the reef and the Herald of St. Haven
& the Herald of Fairhaven laying of anchor
33 months out gave the latter part fine
weather and sailing water

Tuesday July 2nd

fine weather and getting of water the
latter part fine weather
