

Off the Naragansett Islands
Wednesday July 3rd 1850

Begins with fine weather and strong
wind water the latter part painting birds
small

Thursday July 4th

Begins with fine weather and am painting
the birds and one watch on Liberty.
the latter part the same

Friday July 5th

Begins with fine weather and one
watch on Liberty and at 1 P.M. the
steward was taken a vomiting blood in
a large quantity the latter part one
watch on Liberty

Saturday July 6th

Begins with fine weather and one watch
on Liberty the latter part had three combers
to run away so ends one watch on
Liberty

Sunday July 7th

Begins with fine weather and one watch
on Liberty the middle a heavy squall from
W and let go the Leeward Anchor sound
three 24 hours

Monday July 8th

Begins with thick clouds and rain
and one watch on Liberty the latter part
we found one man that run away
so ends

Tuesday July 9th

Begins with a strong breeze from the S.
and getting of wood and other things the
latter part fine weather

Wednesday July 10th

Begins with a fine breeze from S.E. and
getting ready for sea the latter part shifted
3 hands and discharged the fire mate and
one boat steward

Off the Naragansett Islands
Thursday July 11th 1850

Begins with fine weather and getting ready
for sea and waiting two hands the
latter part had one to run away and shifted
a fire mate and one boat steward and
so ends

Friday July 12th

Begins with fine weather and getting
ready to go to sea but waiting for them
to come on board the latter part fine weather
and getting ship ready

Saturday July 13th

Begins with fine weather and about
ready for sea the latter part calm and
fine topsail lost so ends

Sunday July 14th

Begins with fine weather and 1 P.M. got
out anchor and at 4 P.M. discharged
the pilot and standing off with a fine
trade from S.E. the middle part
standing off shore and the weather very
squally and at 8 P.M. the middle
part standing off shore latter standing
off to the Westward along the coast so ends
and leave bearing S.W. by S. 10 miles

Lat 13.22 S. Long 172.22 W

Monday July 15th

Begins with a strong trade and strong
in for the land of fire at 4 P.M. we
had a view of shore to the North
the latter part standing off and on and
two boats on shore a trading for yarns
so ends

Lat 13.27 S. Long 172.04 W

Tuesday July 16th

Begins with a light trade and two boats
in at 4 P.M. the boats came off and
stood off shore and were very light
the middle and latter part a fine trade and
thunder N.N.E. Lat 13.28 S. Long 172.08 W
