

Saturday Oct 5th 1850
Begins with calm weather and heading
to the S. the breeze in sight heading
to the North the latter part a strong
breeze from the Eastward and heading
to the S. Lat 10.30 S. Long 178.00 E

Sunday Oct 6th 1850
Begins with a strong breeze from
S.W. and heading S.E. at 8 P.M. kept the middle
part more moderate and at 8 P.M.
saw Hope Island bearing S.W. and
heading S.E. saw nothing
of note Lat 2.51 S. Long 178.00 E

Monday Oct 7th
Begins with fine weather and
the breeze of W. by N. at 8 P.M. saw
the land and at 10 P.M. and
at 1 P.M. left to the wind N. and all
sail set the middle part fine weather
and at 8 P.M. run down to Hope
Island and got some coconuts and
shifted to water and discharge one more
sick so well Lat 2.43 S. Long 177.00 E

Tuesday Oct 8th
Begins with fine weather and heading
of S.W. at 8 P.M. kept of W. by N. and
the land out of sight at 8 P.M.
and held to the North the
middle part calm. Latter part Rotatus Island
in sight bearing W. S.W. saw nothing
of note Lat 2.35 S. Long 176.10 E

Wednesday Oct 9th
Begins with a light breeze from the
S.W. and for the land at 2 P.M. saw
Jones Cove of and in hour 1500 coconuts
and 100 fowls and at 8 P.M. held to the
South of S.W. Latter part fine so end
Lat 8.25 S. Long 175.00 E

Thursday Oct 10th
Begins with squally weather and
heading to the S. the wind S.W. and
at 8 P.M. shortened sail for
the night the middle and latter
part fine and saw nothing of note
Lat 4.55 S. Long 176.00 E

Friday Oct 11th
Begins with a light breeze from
S.W. and at 8 P.M. took in light
sails for the night the middle part
fine. Latter part squally and saw
nothing of note Lat 5.05 S. Long 176.18 E

Saturday Oct 12th
Begins with squally weather and the
wind all round of the compass
and light sail in and top sails clear
saw the latter part squally and
saw nothing of note Lat 5.15 S.
Long 176.30 E Lat 5.19 S. Long 176.40 E

Sunday Oct 13th 1850
Begins with squally weather and the
wind all round the compass and
saw on sail to the North ran
at 8 P.M. shortened sail for the night
the latter part spoke Ship. George
of Portland 500 lbs. saw nothing
of note Lat 5.53 S. Long 176.58 E

Monday Oct 14th
Begins with a calm and in evening
with the same and the Jones Island
in sight bearing W. by S. the latter
part Baxwell Island in sight and the
Ship. George in sight and a bark seen
these 24 hours Lat 5.40 S. Long 176.18 E
