

West off New Zealand
Wednesday Jan 1st 1854

Begins with a fresh breeze from the North and stirring over the ground to the West the middle part thick weather & wind from the North latter the same

Lat 38° 30' S. Long 164° 28' E

Thursday Jan 2nd 1854

Begins with a breeze from N. and thick weather and stirring W. at 5 P.M. Took in sail for the night the middle part rain & wind from the N. and latter part strong breeze & squalls and under short sail & past a bark heading to the Eastward & under heading to the N.W. Lat 36° 33' S. Long 165° 54' E.

Friday Jan 3rd 1854

Begins with a light air from the North and rain at 4 P.M. a breeze from W.N.W. and heading S.W. and saw a bark stirring N.E. at 7 P.M. ship and took in sail for the night and a strong breeze from W.N.W. the latter part a fine breeze from W.N.W. and stirring of the the Eastward & under no sail Lat 35° 44' S. Long 164° 30' E.

Saturday Jan 4th 1854

Begins with a light breeze from S.W. and stirring E.N.E. at 4 P.M. weather fresh and rainy wind W. and at 6 Shortened sail, stirring N.E. the latter part the same and stirring to the N.E. & under squally Lat 35° 28' S. Long 166° 38' E.

Sunday Jan 5th 1854

Begins with a strong breeze from W. and stirring E.N.E. and the weather squally and no sail the middle part squally latter fine and cruising over the ground and saw nothing but some 20 birds there 24 hours Lat 34° 28' S. Long 168° 11' E.

West from the Three Kings
Monday Jan 8th 1854

Begins with a fine breeze from S.W. and stirring to the Eastward over the ground and saw nothing of note at 4 P.M. Shortened sail for the night stirring E.S.E. the latter part fine and stirring over the ground to the North and saw nothing of note Lat 34° 30' S. Long 169° 43' E.

Tuesday Jan 9th 1854

Begins with a light breeze from the W. N.W. & stirring to the North and some squalls of rain at 7 P.M. Shortened sail for the night heading to the North the middle part fine the latter part stirring E.S.E. and at 11 saw the Three Kings bearing E.S.E. and saw the Corp. & a string of pipe Lat 33° 49' S. Long 170° 54' E.

Wednesday Jan 10th 1854

Begins with light air from S.W. and stirring by the wind and a strong current running to the S.E. at 4 P.M. the Kings bearing S.E. and Shortened sail heading N.W. a light air from S.W. the middle and latter part squally & calm and the Kings bearing S.E. and under a starting broke into pipe and stirring huge down & under no sail Lat 33° 57' S. Long 172° 10' E.

Thursday Jan 11th 1854

Begins with calm weather and some from all points of the compass and at 10 P.M. stirring down & under the middle part calm and latter part a breeze from W.N.W. and stirring to the Eastward and the North Cape in sight and a big sail & then 24 hours Lat 33° 40' S. Long 175° 00' E.
