

Off French Rock & 200,000
Wednesday Feb 26th 1851

Begins with a light breeze from
N.W. and steering N.E. by N. and
all sail set at 4 P.M. took in sail
at nine about 10.00 the latter part
much the same & steering down so
ends Lat 32.17 S Long 178.00 W.

Thursday Feb 27th

Begins with a light breeze from
the North and steering down at 2 P.M.
put in sail and at 4 P.M. took in sail for
the night heading E. N. E. the middle
part heading E. and latter part ship
to the Westward Lat 32.33 S Long 177.35 W.

Friday Feb 28th

Begins with light breeze from the
N.W. & heading the N.E. the middle
part calm the middle the same latter
part a light breeze from N.N.E. and
heading N.W. and one sail in sight
to seaward. Lat 31.58 S Long 178.30 W.

Saturday March 1st 1851

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.N.E.
& rain & heading to the N.W. at 4 P.M.
took in sail and was ship to the Eastward
the middle part a strong sail and latter
part more moderate and made sail and
two sail in sight Lat 32.32 S Long 177.17

Sunday March 2nd

Begins with a strong breeze from N.W.
and heading N. at 2 P.M. spoke ship
Lion of Providence 300 sp. the latter part a
light rain from the N. steering to the N.W.
and saw French Rock bearing N.W. by W. dist
230 miles and 2 sail in sight & ends

Lat 31.42 S

Long 179.00 W.

Off French Rock & 200,000
Monday March 3rd

Begins with a light breeze from the
N. and heading to the N.E. the middle
part calm the latter part wind from
N. & rain and a strong breeze
rapt down Lat 32.17 S Long 178.00 W.

Tuesday March 4th

Begins with a gale from N.N.E. and
heading E. and two & three sail in
at 4 P.M. took in main top sail &
Foremast stay sail at blowing
being at 12 the wind abated some and
was held to the N.W. and set main
top sail & Foremast stay sail the latter
part the wind increased and so ended
blowing very heavy and heading N.

Lat 31.58 S Long 178.30 W.

Wednesday March 5th

Begins with a heavy gale from W.
and heading N.N.W. at 5 P.M. was
held to W. the middle moderate and
latter part calm & 2 sail in sight &
and heading N.W. Lat 31.19 S Long 178.50

Thursday March 6th

Begins with a calm and heading
to the N. and two ships in sight
the middle part calm and latter part
a breeze from the North and spoke the
ship Lion and went on board
to get a Band made for the ruler &
so ends Lat 31.14 S Long 178.30 W.

Friday March 7th

Begins with a light breeze from
the North and heading to the Westward
the latter part rain and in company
with the Lion and got my iron trunk
down for the ruler so ended it
being calm Lat 31.10 S Long 178.36 W.
