

N.W. from Sunday Island
Tuesday March 25th 1857
Began with a strong breeze from
E.S.E. and heading N.E. at 2
P.M. were ship to the south
and the C. W. Morgan in sight to
windward the middle & latter part
a strong breeze from E.S.E. and
meridally main topsail so ended these
24 hours Lat 28.51 S. Long 179.30 E

Wednesday March 26th
Began with a strong breeze from E.S.E.
& heading S. and at work on main
topsail at 4 P.M. part the Leachbrook
of Jan. topsail and went out at
8 P.M. at 3 took in sail for the night
the middle and latter part a strong
breeze & very rough and at work
on the fore topsail to end under
short sail Lat 27.31 S. Long 179.27 E

Thursday March 27th
Began with strong breeze and
clear weather and heading S.E. W.
and made up a running the
fore topsail at 5 P.M. went to work
took in sail for the night the
latter part a strong breeze and heading
to the N.E. & simplified a running the
main topsail so ended these 24 hours
with rough weather Lat 27.05 S. Long 179.30 E

Friday March 28th
Began with a strong breeze from
E.S.E. & heading N.E. at 4 P.M. were
ship to the south and at 8 took in
sail for the night the middle and
latter part a strong breeze and at 11
A.M. spoke the Christopher Michel of
Nantucket 1500 Hk. Spinn. so ended
these 24 hours Lat 27.00 S. Long 179.30 E

N.W. from Sunday Island
Saturday March 29th
Began with a strong breeze from
E.S.E. heading N.E. in company
with the C. Mitchell at 5 P.M. took
in fore & main topsail & were ship
to the south the middle & latter part
heavy rain and strong breeze from
the N.E. Lat 27.40 S. Long 179.30 E

Sunday March 30th
Began with a strong breeze from
S.E. and a heavy rain and heading
to the S.E. at 5 P.M. a light
air from the W. and began to
clear up the latter part blowing strong
and at the fore & main topsail &
took them in again so ended the wind
N. N. W. & rain Lat 27.37 S. Long 179.32 W.

Monday March 31st
Began with a strong breeze & rain
wind from N. N. W. and heading
to the N.E. at 5 P.M. wind haled to
N. N. W. & a plenty of rain the middle part
the same latter part a breeze from the W. and
sail on studding to the S. so ended
no whales Lat 27.58 S. Long 179.07 W.

Tuesday April 1st 1857
Began with a fine breeze from the
Westward and fair weather and steering
to the south at 5 P.M. took in sail for
the night the middle and latter part
fine and one sail in sight so ended
a steering to the North and saw
nothing Lat 28.11 S. Long 179.00 W.

Wednesday April 2nd
Began fair and at 6 P.M. saw the
Christopher Mitchell a whaling boat
did not see the whale the latter part
a fresh breeze and no whales
Lat 27.20 S. Long 179.22 W.
