

West from Tuesday Island

Friday April 11th 1854

Begins with strong breeze from E and
heading N.N.E. and at 3 P.M. hoist 1st &
Main Topsail at 5 P.M. took in sail
for the night with latter part a fine
breeze from E and heading N.N.E. and
Main sail & the 1st & 2nd T. replace a
main T. Main T. sail so ends third
S. hour. Lat 28° 13' S. Long 179° 40' W.

Saturday April 12th

Begins with a fine breeze from E.
and thick weather to be heading by
the wind N.N.E. and one ship in
sight to the South and at 1 P.M. saw
up for her at 5 P.M. left to the South
& took in sail for the night not being
sailing at horizon spoke ship Long of
Brendine 350 tons & went on board of
her & made Lat 28° 15' S. Long 179° 55' W.

Sunday April 13th

Begins with strong breeze from the
S.E. and heading E.N.E. and in even
with the line of S at 8 P.M. came
on board & took in Fore sail & Close reef
the Main T. sail the latter part squally
and heading N.E. Lat 29° 03' S. Long 179° 58' E

Monday April 14th

Begins with a strong breeze from the E &
and heading to the North and at 8
P.M. came ship to the South the middle
and latter part squally and under Close
reef T. sails Lat 29° 16' S. Long 179° 55' W.

Tuesday April 15th

Begins with a strong breeze from the
Eastward and under Close reef T. sails
at 1 P.M. took in Fore & Main T. sail
& Fore sail it blowing hard and at 8
took in Main the middle part the same
latter part blowing very heavy from
E & S.W. Lat 29° 40' S. Long 179° 30' E

Wednesday April 16th

Begins with a heavy gale from E.
and heading S.E. at 3 P.M. it began
to pull to the South and abated some
but a very heavy sea on at 5 P.M. took
up the weather boats & wore ship to
N.E. the wind from S.E. the middle &
latter part fair weather and a very heavy
swell on so made heading to the N.E.
& on sail in night Lat 29° 33' S. Long 179° 08' E

Thursday April 17th

Begins with fine weather wind from
S.E. and steering E.N.E. at 1 P.M. saw
black fish to the South and the crew
drew the middle part fair latter part
a light breeze from W. and steering to
the Eastward and employed a Coopering
Breed and so forth Lat 29° 20' S. Long 179° 28' E

Friday April 18th

Begins with squally weather and wind
from W. to S.W. and heading to the
Eastward at 8 took in sail and wore
ship to the S. & the middle and latter
part fine weather wind from S to E & E
and heading to the Eastward and saw
a plenty of Porpoises but no whales
so ended third S. hour Lat 29° 19' S. Long 178° 55' W.
