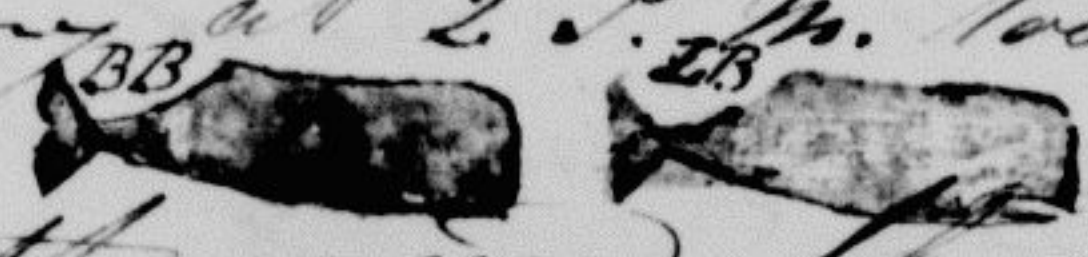


N^o 11 from Sandy Island
Saturday April 19th 1851

Begins with a light breeze from the
S.E. and heading E.N.E. and saw
Jaws but no whales the middle part
fine at 8 A.M. laid ship to the south
and the weather squally at 12 past
saw several and then proved to be
sp. whales at 10 lowered and struck 2
He ended with rain weather wind
from S.E. & N.E. Lat 27.00 S
Long 178.40 W.

Sunday April 20th

Begins with a fresh breeze from S.E.
& rain at 2 P.M. took the whale along
side  & at 3 o'clock cutting
and the second blowing on after taking
of 2 or three times we got 1/2 of the
body of one & the head in and
gave it up for the night at blowing
hard and very rough at 1 A.M. parted
on the chain and lost a part of one
whale at 1 P.M. ship and came cutting the
other one at blowing very hard and at 11
finest hit after making a very rough turn
so ended with a gale from S.E. &
heading S.W. Lat 26.45 S Long 179.00 W.

Monday April 21st

Begins with a heavy Gale from the
S.E. and a clearing up the deck &
so forth heading S.W. at 2 A.M. the
gale abated and set main topsail and at
6 o'clock sailing and set fore sail & the main
topsail the latter part squally and a
heavy swell on so ended heading
to the S.W. Lat 25.45 S Long 179.00 W.

N^o 12 from Sandy Island
Tuesday April 22nd 1851

Begins with squally weather and
light air from the South and in the
evening at 8 P.M. took in sail heading
S.E. with weather fair but a very
heavy swell on and rowing about
at a great rate at 8 A.M. finished
stowing down the latter
part fine weather and saw Black
fish but no whales Lat 27.00 S
Long 179.07 W.

Wednesday April 23rd

Begins with a fine breeze from S.E.
and heading S. and some squalls of
rain at 8 P.M. took in sail for the
night the middle and latter part
squalls of rain and standing to the
South so ended Lat 27.00 S Long 179.15 W.

Thursday April 24th

Begins with a fresh breeze from S.E.
and heading S. under short sail and
the weather rainy at 8 P.M. took in
sail for the night the middle part
fair latter part a storming down and
heading N.E. by E. so ended with fair weather
and nothing to be seen Lat 28.04 S
Long 179.46 W.

Friday April 25th

Begins with a fine breeze from S.E.
and heading S.E. by E. and stowing down
in the after hold at 3 P.M. stopped
for the night as we could not finish
the latter part finished stowing down and
the weather fine & saw nothing of note
so ended Lat 27.24 S Long 179.10 W.
