

N.W. from Sunday Island
Tuesday May 5th 1854

Begins with a strong breeze from N.E.
and heading E.S.E. the weather thick
I employed in mending the mainsail at
1 P.M. bent it up & took in fore & main
sails & foresail it blowing on and
soon raining the middle and latter
the sun and under short sail
so ends Lat 28° 35' S. Long 178° 52' W.

Wednesday May 6th

Begins with a strong breeze from
S.W. and rain & heading E.S.E.
at 4 P.M. wore ship to the N.W.
at 11 A.M. wore ship to the east the latter
part a gale & rain so ends the 24
hours Lat 28° 55' S. Long 178° 40' W.

Thursday May 7th

Begins with a gale from the North &
heading E.N.E. and rain the middle
part wind held to W. latter part the
weather fine wind S.W. and steering S.E.
so ends Lat 29° 01' S. Long 178° 41' W.

Friday May 8th

Begins with fine weather wind from
S.W. & steering of E.S.E. at 8 P.M.
took in sail for the night & steering
E.S.E. at 12 P.M. left to South at 10
at 6 A.M. Sunday Island in sight bearing
E. 25 miles dist. so ends Lat 29° 17' S.
Long 178° 04' W.

Saturday May 9th

Begins with a light breeze from S.W. and
at 1 P.M. two boats went in a fishing
at 4 the came up, and Sticks of Shore E.N.E.
& a light air from the S.W. the latter
steering by the wind S.E. and fair
weather and sun perpendicular and
catched 2 sea turtles Lat 28° 39' S.
Long 176° 59' W.

E.N.E. & N.E. from Sunday Island
Sunday May 10th 1854

Begins with fine weather wind N.W.
& N.N.W. and steering by the wind to
the N.E. the middle part the sun
latter part a squall from S.E. and
rain, steering N.W. so ends the 24
hours Lat 29° 50' S. Long 178° 10' W.

Monday May 11th

Begins with squally weather and
wind from S.E. to the N.W. from there
to S.E. again and working to the
N.W. and the latter part steering N.N.W.
and employed in mending the fore sail
so ends Lat 28° 00' S. Long 176° 50' W.

Tuesday May 12th

Begins with a fresh breeze from the
South and steering N.N.W. at 5 P.M.
Spoke Ship Richard Michel of Nantucket
was with the middle part squally
and heading E. at 9 P.M. Spoke
Baron Martha of N Bedford 12 months
old 355 lbs so ends steering N.N.E.
under short sail Lat 29° 20' S.
Long 176° 15' W.

Wednesday May 13th

Begins with a strong breeze from
the S. steering N.N.E. in evening with
the Martha & Richard Michel at 8 P.M.
took in sail and left to the middle
and latter part squally and steering of
to the North. the 24 ends the 24
hours Lat 28° 33' S. Long 176° 00' W.

Thursday May 14th

Begins with a strong breeze from S.W.
and steering N.N.W. and at 5 P.M.
left to and S. sail in sight the latter
part spoke ship Monticello of Nantucket
8 months 300 & ship Pegasus 900
so ends Lat 28° 15' S. Long 175° 50' W.
