

On the Line
Saturday July 26th 1837

Begins with calm weather and boiling
2 three boats of in a hour at 1
6 P.M. took the dead whale along
side ~~and~~ and took the boats up,
were ship and towed the whale to the
S.E. at 6 A.M. being cutting off part of
finisht and made sail to the S.E.
at 4 P.M. saw more whales at 9 hours
and lost the run of them at 11 came
along side and run of N.W. and W. to
raise them again at midday saw a
dead whale from look him along side
so much. Lat 00.26 S. Long 176.38 W.

Sunday July 27th 1837
Begins with a calm and boiling the whale
again and lower struck 2 and at
5 got them along side and started
back ~~and~~ and giving ready to
back at 7 started the whale and heading
to the S.E. at 8 A.M. saw one sail to midday
in run N.W. of the line from at
8 P.M. cutting and at 11 finisht and had
to make sail to cut char of the line
the current being very strong, being N.W.
so much. Lat 00.13 S. Long 176.02 W.

Monday July 28th 1837
Begins with calm weather and boiling
at 1 P.M. took the dead whale and run cutting the
other whale at 3 finisht and at 4
were ship to the S. at 6 the line having
East 5 miles of the latter part heading
S.E. and a boiling and a strong
current setting to the Westward
Lat 00.05 S. Long 176.02 W.

On the Line
Tuesday July 29th 1837

Begins with a calm and boiling heading to
the S.E. at 5 P.M. could deliver the
works and were ship and set the
mainsail heading South the latter
part calm and saw nothing of note
so much. Lat 00.10 S. Long 176.39 W.

Wednesday July 30th 1837
Begins with a calm and boiling heading
to the South and at 6 P.M. lost a
main top sail the middle cable
lets first a stowing down in the
after hold and so much saw nothing
of note. Lat 00.13 S. Long 176.58 W.

Thursday July 31st 1837
Begins with a light air and
calm and in place a stowing
down at 4 P.M. 5 P.M. hunted
down for the night the latter
part squally and stowing down
so much. Lat 00.06 S. Long 177.06 W.

Friday August 1st 1837
Begins with squally weather and
stowing down at 4 P.M. finisht
and set ship to the S.E. the latter
part fine. Lat 00.36 S. Long 176.28 W.

Saturday Aug 2nd 1837
Begins with fine weather and
heading S.E. at 5 P.M. saw
whale and lower struck one and
at 6 P.M. took him along side
~~and~~ and took him in tow heading
S.E. at 1 P.M. were ship and at 1 P.M.
were cutting at 8 finisht and made
all sail so much. Lat 00.42 S. Long 176.43 W.
