Sunday Aug 3rd 1851

Begins with a fine breeze from E. and heading N.N.E. and sailing at 1 P.M. (Cold down) and the latter part heading N.E. and on sail in sight to windward so could Lat 00.25 S. Long 176.31 W.

Monday Aug 4th

Begins with a light breeze from E. and heading E.S.E. at 3 P.M. spoke the Mountains of Nantucket 250 W. of Sp. 200 W. and the middle part light air from N.E. and heading to the S.E. Lat 00.41 S. Long 176.32 W.

Tuesday Aug 5th

Begins with a light air from N.E. and heading to the S.E. and at 8 P.M. set ship to the North at 4 A.M. set to North and the latter part heading E.S.E. and a bark in sight to the N.W. so could we saw nothing Lat 00.25 S. Long 176.33 W.

Wednesday Aug 6th

Begins with a light breeze from N.E. and heading to the North at 2 P.M. past a bark at 6 P.M. set to the S.E. at 4 A.M. set to the N.E. and a fine breeze and staying near in the fore hold so could then 16 hours Lat 1.07 S. Long 176.02 W.

Thursday Aug 7th

Begins with a fine breeze from E. S. E. and heading N.E. by N. and finally steering down and was at the ship at 4 A.M. 3 sail in sight at 9 saw one a whaling to Leeward and run for him at 10 Leeward at 11 P.M. saw one bark Lat 00.29 S. Long 176.15 W.

Friday August 8th 1851

Begins with a fresh trade and in chase of the whales and at 3 Leeward and at 4 a bark one at 5 a bark another and one the men drew and the others at 11 P.M. took along side  and more ship to the S.E. in company with bark Rose of New Bedford at 11 P.M. saw cutting at 8 P.M. and at 11 P.M. sailing so could they weather Squally Lat 00.43 S. Long 176.32 W.

Saturday Aug 9th

Begins with a strong breeze from the N.E. and sailing and a ship of bark in sight the latter part fine and saw nothing Lat 00.50 S. Long 176.33 W.

Sunday Aug 10th

Begins with a fine trade and heading N.N.E. at 12 P.M. spoke the bark Rose of N. Bedford and on 11th the middle part squally latter part the same and steering by the wind to the N.E. in company with the bark Lat 00.15 S. Long 176.34 W.

Monday Aug 11th

Begins with a strong breeze from N.E. and heading E.S.E. at 3 P.M. set ship to the South at 8 A.M. saw a ship a whaling to windward and took ship for him so could no whales Lat 00.15 S. Long 176.25 W.

Tuesday Aug 12th

Begins with a light air from N.E. and saw ship of Nantucket and two whales along side to windward the latter part 4 sail in sight and no whales Lat 00.38 S. Long 176.10 W.
