Friday Aug 22nd 1851

Begins with fine weather and at 2 P.M. comm. sailing and heading S.E. N. at 5 more ship and took in the light sails for the night the Middle here specially and kept down and held steady the work on account of rain the latter part fair and a southerly heading to the South so wind. Lat 00.40 S. Long 176.35 W.

Saturday Aug 23rd

Begins with a fresh breeze from E and heading to the N.E. and sailing at 2 P.M. could down and down Main Tack at 8 past the Cape of Northcut a boiling the latter part a strong breeze Lat 00.01 S. Long 176.40 W.

Sunday Aug 24th

Begins with a strong breeze and heading S.E. at 4 P.M. Tack ship to the South the Middle and latter part squally weather Lat 00.11 S. Long 176.35 W.

Monday Aug 25th

Begins with squally weather and at 4 P.M. spoke ship. Cape Mores of Saloth 650 fms the Middle and latter part a light breeze and a minding the S.E. fms. Lat 00.38 S. Long 176.50 W.

Tuesday Aug 26th

Begins with a heavy Squall from E. and in play continuing the S.E. fms and morning the sails the Middle and latter part a fresh breeze and saw nothing of note. one ship in sight to windward so wind and at work on the fly S.E. Lat 00.38 S. Long 176.45 W.

Wednesday Aug 27th 1851

Begins with a strong breeze and heading S.E. and one ship in sight to windward the Middle and latter part a strong breeze and saw Black Fish but no whales Lat 1.20 S. Long 176.50

Thursday Aug 28th

Begins with a fresh breeze and in play a breaker but the forepeak & steering of between decks is so farth at 3 P.M. one ship in sight of the Lee Bore the Middle and latter part a strong breeze and saw nothing of note. Lat 00.39 S. Long 176.35 W.

Friday Aug 29th

Begins with a fresh breeze and strong S.E. at 3 P.M. Tack to the South and saw no whales to day the latter part stirring N.E. W. and a fresh breeze and saw nothing Lat 00.36 S. Long 176.25 W.

Saturday Aug 30th Long 178.25 W

Begins with a strong breeze and strong of N.W. at 4 past 3 more ship to the South at 4 past 4 saw whales and a ship a whaling at 5 sawers and struck 4 and got on boat store and lost two whales they were dead (it took two along side  had down. Threading N. at 8 A.M. at 9 finished same spoke the forepeak of N.W. and another ship to windward so and a minding boats and getting ready to ball so wind and heading to the South. Lat 00.08 S. Long 178.25 W.
