Tuesday Nov 4th 1851

Begins with a fine breeze from E.N.E. and heading to the North at 6 P.M. Tackled Ship to the S.E. at 2 A.M. Tackled Ship to the north and a fine breeze latter part a veering bit to show down

Lat 2.40 S. Long 176.58 E

Wednesday Nov 5th

Begins with fine weather and a strong breeze at 6 P.M. finished at 1 saw Roches Island having E. dist 12 miles and heading N.E. at 9 Tackled to the S. at 7 A.M. Tackled to the N.E. and one ship in sight to windward and one whale

Lat 2.56 S. Long 176.44 E

Thursday Nov 6th

Begins with a fine back and heading to the N.E. and one ship in sight and no whales at 9 P.M. Tackled Ship to the S. the latter part heading S.E. and hands employed a chumming the iron work out side of the Ship and so on

Lat 3.15 S. Long 176.26 E

Friday Nov 7th

Begins with a light breeze from N.E. and heading E.S.E. at 6 P.M. saw black fish and no whales the middle part squally and latter a strong breeze and reefed main and heading E. by S. Lat 4.06 S. Long 176.19 E

Saturday Nov 8th

Begins with a strong breeze from N.E. and heading E.S.E. the middle and latter part light breeze and at Meridian Tackled Ship to the N.E. Lat 5.09 S. Long 176.47 E

and no whales to day

Sunday Nov 9th 1851

Begins with a light air from E.S.E. and heading N.E. and a heavy swell on and nothing to be seen the middle and latter part squally and split the fore top sail so much Lat 4.58 S. Long 176.09 E

Monday Nov 10th

Begins with a fine breeze from the Eastward and heading to the N.E. and saw 4 whales the middle part a strong breeze from E.N.E. latter part a headless swell fore & main top sails so much. These 2 hours

Lat 3.24 S. Long 176.06 E

Tuesday Nov 11th

Begins with a fresh breeze from N.E. and heading N.N.W. and at 3 P.M. finished sending 1/2 m top sails at 1/2 sight of 2 whales top sail the middle part light breeze and latter the same and sent a new fore sail & main & jallantail so much heading to the N.N.W.

Lat 2.53 S. Long 176.46 E

Wednesday Nov 12th

Begins with a light breeze from the E and steering N.N.W. at 6 P.M. took in light sails and held to the wires for the night at 2 A.M. steering of 275 saw Ratchet Island facing to the N.W. at 9 got over and came on shore and we left the water that I took from there, and with a white man to work his passage at 11 pas 9 put away for N. Zealand some E.S.E.

Lat 2.43 S. Long 176.15 E
