Tuesday Jan 6th 1852

Begins with calm weather and no
whales and at 3 P.M. close down the
sails and took in light sail for the
night the latter part a light air from
S.E. and heading N.N.W. and implies
making a fore sail so ends and
no whales Lat 29-10 S. Long 179-45 E.

Wednesday Jan 7th

Begins with a light air from S.E.
and heading N. and at 4 P.M. pour
the fit. They put in and spent it at
1 saw whales and before there to
be disappointed at 8 shortened sail
for the night the latter part all sail
set heading N.N.E. and implies a
heading the main sail and sound #
and no whales Lat 28-45 S. Long 179-32

Thursday Jan 8th

Begins with fine breeze from E.S.E.
and heading N.E. at 4 P.M. saw
plenty of porpoises at 6 took in
light sail for the night the latter part
a fine breeze and heading to the South
and no whales Lat 28-02 S. Long 178-37 W.

Friday Jan 9th

Begins with a fine breeze from the
eastward and heading S.W. and
saw 3 fish & a plenty of porpoises at 6
P.M. took in sail for the night the
latter part fine weather and heading
South and no whales to be seen so
ends there 26 hours

Lat 29-20 S. Long 179-25 W.

W. H. from Sunday Island
Saturday Jan 10th 1852

Begins with a light breeze from the
eastward and steering S. at 4 P.M. hold
to the wind S.E. at 6 took in sail
for the night at 12 were ship to the S?
at 3 P.M. saw 4 whales a fine quick to
S.W. and lower but could not come
in with them the wind being very light
at 11 took up the boat so ends there 26
hours and no whales Lat 29-40 S. Long 179-37 W.

Sunday Jan 11th

Begins with fine weather and heading
N.N.W. at 5 P.M. saw the whales a light
point on the weather from at 7 took in
sail & were ship the middle rain latter part
wind from all points of the compass and very
light and no whales Lat 29-48 S. Long 179-37 W.

Monday Jan 12th

Begins with a light air from W. and S.W.
and heading to the south at 4 calm at 7
took in sail for the night with a light
air from W. the middle calm latter part a
breeze from W. and to S. heading implies
a washing the ship outside and nothing
to be seen Lat 30-19 S. Long 179-56 W.

Tuesday Jan 13th

Begins with a light air from S. and heading
W. at 2 P.M. rainy and saw 2 ships to the
W. and at 4 calm at 7 a light breeze
from S.E. and shortened sail for the night
the latter part specially fine and light
and all round the compass and saw two
ships to the Westward and so ends
there 26 hours Lat 30-19 S.
