Wednesday Jan 14th 1852
 Begins with a light breeze from S.
 and steering W. land at 5 P.M. we
 M. V. W. saw two ships and took
 one to have a whale along side at
 4. Thirteen sail for the night
 the middle part equally at 8. A.M. saw
 3 ships at 9 spoke the C. W. Morgan a
 steamer down a large whale and
 as well with a strong breeze and
 no whales. Lat 29.51 S. Long 179.06 E.

Thursday Jan 15th
 Begins with a fresh breeze from S.W.
 and heading N.W. at 5 P.M. we
 spoke and 2 ships in sight at 7
 took in 12. Morgan spoke for the night
 the latter part a strong breeze and steering
 to the North East and the Morgan in view
 so ends. Lat 29.52 S. Long 179.10 E.

Friday Jan 16th
 Begins with a strong breeze from S.E.
 and steering over the ground to the N.E.
 at 5 P.M. took in sail for the night
 the latter part steering to the S.W. and
 saw nothing. Lat 28.53 S. Long 179.58 E.

Saturday Jan 17th
 Begins with a light breeze from the
 S.E. and heading S.W. in company
 with the Morgan the latter part fine
 and wind from E. steering S.W.
 and employed a painter the latter
 so ends and no whales to be seen
 & the Morgan in sight so ends
 Lat 29.33 S. Long 179.06 E.

Sunday Jan 18th 1852
 Begins with a light breeze from the
 Eastward and steering S.W. at 5 P.M.
 held to the wind till took in sail
 for the night heading S.E. and no
 whales the latter part fine and we sail
 in sight so ends Lat 30.52 S. Long 178.58 E.

Monday Jan 19th
 Begins with a light breeze from the East
 and steering to the S. at 5 P.M. spoke
 ship Robabanta of Sydney 300 tons
 the latter part fine and a painter the
 ship but did not capture one fish of
 oil we found a fishing so ends & 3 ships
 in sight. Lat 31.28 S. Long 178.56 E.

Tuesday Jan 20th
 Begins with a light breeze from the East
 and steering to the S.E. and two ships in
 sight at 5 P.M. thirteen sail for the night
 the latter part saw 5 fish & 3 steamers
 & 2 ships in sight so ends a painter
 ship. Lat 32.00 S. Long 179.55 E.

Wednesday Jan 21st
 Begins with a light breeze from N.E. by E.
 and heading E. by S. at 7 P.M. took in sail
 for the night 2 ships in sight the
 middle and latter part light air from N.E.
 to N.W. Lat 32.50 S. Long 179.59 E.

Thursday Jan 22nd
 Begins with a light air from N.N.E. and
 at 1 P.M. took in ship to the N.W. at 5.
 spoke the Camurata of N. Bedford 100 tons
 the latter part a strong breeze from N.N.E.
 and steering of W. and at 10 spoke the
 bark Martha of N. Bedford so ends steering
 N.W. in company with the C. W. Morgan
 Lat 31.55 S. Long 179.20 E.
