

Bound in to Port

Friday July 23rd 1852

Began with a gale from N.N.E. and at 1 P.M. ript down and spoke the Morgan & put away for the Bay of Islands in company with the ship. At 5 took in Mizzen Top-sail at 7 took up the 2nd W Boat & steering S.W. by W. the Middle rain and heavy squalls from the North latter part clear and a light air from the N.W. and saw nothing of note. Lat 32.33 S. Long 149.14 E.

Saturday July 24th

Began with a light breeze from the N.W. and at 5 squally & ript down and steering S.W. under short sail in company with the Morgan the Middle part moderate latter part a strong breeze from W.S.W. and heading S. and S.W. E. so ended. Lat 33.33 S. Long 149.15 E.

Sunday Jan 25th

Began with a strong breeze from the W.S.W. and heading to the S. under double reef. Top-sails the Middle squally and latter part more moderate and struck out reef so ended. Lat 34.33 S. Long 149.58 E.

Monday Jan 26th

Began with a strong breeze from S.W. and heading S. at 2 P.M. Tack'd ship at 5 very squally and ript down and took in 1st & Main sail at 8 blowing hard at 8 took in all boats except 1st & Main Top-sail & fore and aft sails the latter part more moderate. Lat 34.42 S. Long 149.58 E.

Bound in to the Bay of Islands

Tuesday Jan 27th 1853

Began with a strong breeze from S. and a heavy swell on from W.W. and heading to W.S.W. at 2 P.M. let out the reef and at 5 took in 1st & Main Top-sail and sail the Morgan of the Le Bann the Middle part wind hauled to W. and was ship to the S. and at 8 P.M. went to a gale & at 9 hours to 10 miles the 2nd hour.

Lat 35.08 S. Long 150.38 E.

Wednesday Jan 28th

Began with a gale from W. and at 2 P.M. took in Main Top-sail and iron ship to the North it blowing very heavy at 4 the gale abated and the 2nd & Main Top-sail at 6 1/2 Mizzen Top-sail & Main sail on and wind from S.W. the Morgan to windward at 7 began to blow on and took in the 3rd Mizzen Top-sail at 8 blowing very heavy and in fore sail & Main Top-sail the latter part blowing hard from S.W. Lat 34.30 S. Long 149.36 E.

Thursday Jan 29th

Began with a gale from the South and began to ript down at 11 and at 12 the latter part more moderate and got ript Top-sails on and were ship to the S. in company with the Morgan so ended the 2nd hour. Lat 34.33 S. Long 149.31 E.

Friday Jan 30th

Began with a strong breeze from S. heading S.W. and all sail set at 5 P.M. spoke the Morgan and the Middle and latter part a light breeze from S.W. & W.S.W. and heading to the South so ended & employed 2 making room between decks & so forth.

Lat 34.00 S. Long 149.32 E.
