

Bound in to N Zealand

Saturday Jan 5th 1852

Begins with a light breeze from N.W. & heading S. and thick weather at 9 o'clock ship to the N.W. at 4 A.M. wind from N.W. & ship again the latter part heading up. With thin weather thick and rainy Sat 1 Long

Sunday Feb 1st 1852

Begins with a light breeze from N.W. wind weather thick and the morning out of sight and we heading S.W. at 2 P.M. Tack to ship to the North supposing the poor lights not far of the middle part below and at 4 A.M. took a light breeze from the North & steering N. and weather thick at 11 saw Cape Brin bearing S.W. by W & the poor lights 20 miles weather very thick and so forth Sat 34.59 S. Long 175.26

Monday Feb 2nd

Begins with thick weather and land to far of to get in. Tack to of N.W. wind N.E. at 3 P.M. it cleared up and running of to vessels the same N.W. Cape Brin bearing S.W. by S. dist 20 miles at 4 o'clock am heading in and weather fine wind S at 6 P.M. wind held to the North & from that to N.W. & rain at 11 saw Cape Brin 4 miles dist and ship to of 20 miles Sat 35.05 S. Long 174.35

Tuesday Feb 3rd

Begins with a strong breeze from the N.W. and thick weather of from the land at 2 P.M. Tack in the weather cleared up at 8 Cape Brin bearing S.E. 8 miles and Tack to of and a ship past bound out of the bay at 5 P.M. we started for the bay in company with the Columbia of Montserrat and at 9 o'clock to an

in Port

anchors in 6 fathoms of water and found ship Venus of N. Sailed from Logan of St. Montserrat of St. & Warren of Tisbury the latter part a small Cooper's Oil between Deck

Wednesday Feb 4th

Begins with a fine breeze from the N.W. & a Cooper's Oil at 6 P.M. fine and washed of the Deck the latter part a fresh breeze from the N.W.

Thursday Feb 5th

Begins with a strong breeze from the Westward and a gale of wind and water and getting of wind. The latter part the Morgan came in to the anchors in 6 fathoms of water

Friday Feb 6th

Begins with fine weather and a gale of wind & water and the latter part the same

Saturday Feb 7th

Begins with fine weather and wind from the S.E. & a Calcutta ship & steaming away water & so forth the middle and latter part fine weather and one watch on Liberty

Sunday Feb 8th

Begins with fine weather and employed a blacking hands and so forth at 3 P.M. ship Navigator came in 4 months but above the middle part fine at 5 P.M. had an man to clean Deck and put him in from the latter part fine and so on

Monday Feb 9th

Begins with fine weather at 4 P.M. the 6th Creek came in and had 500 bbls 18 hours
