Thursday Feb 26th 1852.

Begins with a gale from S.E. and
 tending to and rain at 6 P.M. com
 clearing up soon and saw the sun
 the latter part fair and double reef
 Tophail on Stirling N.E. and some
 sailing Lat 33.20 S. Long 146.45 E

Friday Feb 27th

Begins with a fresh breeze from
the S. steering N. E. reaches double
reefs. Topsails the latter part fine
and all sail on one hand
employed about ship duty & under
these 24 hours Lat 32.34. Long 177.18 E

Saturday Feb. 28th

begins with a Calm and heading
 to the S. at 6 P.M. a Light breeze
 from the S.E. and wear Ship. Made
 S.E. and took in 1/2 Breeze. Took
 Gallant'sail for the night the
 Middle Calm at 3 A.M. a Light Breeze
 from the Eastward and Made sail
 at 6 Saw 1/2 whales and a bark in
 sight at 4 Towed at 9 ^{1/2} miles (19 1/2)
 at 10 took him along side
 and two boats in chase of the
 so called. Lat 32° 42' S. Long 177° 10' E

Sunday Feb 24th

departed with a light breeze from E and
in Chase at 4.0 P.M. Comm. cutting and at
4 past then the boat came up the
Chase at 5 finish cutting and took
in sail at 11 Comm. to land and the
weather thick the latter part the day.
and Calm Lat 34.58 S. Long 47.00 E.

Monday March, 1st 1852.

beginning with a Liegt air from N^W
and a boiling the weather thick at 6^o
P.M. Shortland sail for the night,
and the wind from S. at 10 A.M.
Finished boiling and a fine breeze
from the South and all sail set steering
to the Eastward Lat 31.10 S. Long 178.00 E

Tuesday March 2nd

Begins with fine weather wind from
S and heading to the E. at 5.30 P.M.
thunder sail for the night the
lights part a light as an saw nothing
of note Lat 35.20 N. Long 148.56 E

Wednesday March 3rd

beginning with the Lighter from J. S. W.
and heading L. S. W. and saw one sail
striding to the North at ^{low} employed a
Mendocino Spanker. M. Spenser also Coasting
Oile at 6.30 P. M. back to ship to the W. W.
Shattered sail for the night the latter
part showing down in the North hold and
stern of J. S. W. Lat 30.50 N. Long 144.12 E

Thursday March 4th

Begin with fair weather and strong
N. E. wind S. E. at 2 P. M. finished
stowing down at 5 took in sail
for the night the latter part rainy and
wind from E. and at 11 took in J. &
Main Top sail and left at the wind so ended
the 26 hours Lat 30.00 S. Long 179.53 E.

Friday March 5th

Begins with a rain storm. Pass E. and
Cheshire N. N. E. under short sail at 10
P.M. Run ship to the S. E. and took in
Fore sail and close reef Main Top sail the
Latter part of the night and set the Topsails & Fore
& Main sail so under heading to the N. W. wind
N. N. E. Lat 50.10 S. Long 179.31 E.
