Monday March 18th 1852

Begins with a fresh breeze from S.E. and squall of rain & boiling at 8 P.M. took in sail for the night at 10 had a heavy squall of rain and boats down for the rain at 10 started the fires again at 12 finished the middle fire weather and latter part fine and clearing N.N.W. and nothing to be seen Lat 28.50 S

Long 179.08 W.

Tuesday March 19th

Begins with a fresh breeze from E.S.E. and heading N.E. by N. at 5 P.M. squally and took in sail for the night the middle part a strong breeze and saw the latter part a gale and for 2 M. topsail in and cooping oil to stow down so well Lat 27.46 S

Long 179.25 W.

Wednesday March 20th

Begins with a gale from E.S.E. at 2 P.M. started down the oil between D.S. at 6 finished and heading to the south the middle and latter part a strong breeze and for 2 M. topsail on and saw nothing of note Lat 28.24 S

Long 179.54 W.

Thursday March 21st

Begins with a strong breeze from E.S.E. and heading S by W. at 6 took in sail for the night the middle part wind hald to the S.E. and wore ship to the Eastward and latter part all sail on and fair weather and no whales to day so well Lat 28.50 S

Long 179.40 W.

Friday March 19th 1852

Begins with a fine breeze from S.E. and heading E and weather thick and no whales to be seen the middle and latter part fine and heading E and saw nothing Lat 28.52 S Long 178.55 W.

Saturday March 20th

Begins with fine weather and wind from S. and heading S.E. by E. and at 8 P.M. started sail for the night the middle part calm latter a fine breeze from the S.E. and heading E. N.E. so well Lat 28.52 S

Long 178.11 W.

Sunday March 21st

Begins with a strong breeze from the S.E. and squally at 2 P.M. reefed down at 3 started of both at 4 took in 2 M. topsail & put the fore sail on ship to the S. the wind from E. and blowing strong at 6 took up the starboard boat the middle and latter part blowing a gale and weather clear. wind E. & saw a bark of the Line quarter so well Lat 28.45 S Long 178.25 W.

Monday March 22nd

Begins with a gale from E and heading S.E. by E. and a bark under her in the middle & latter part much the same and heading S.E. Lat 29.13 S

Long 178.44 W.

Tuesday March 23rd

Begins with a gale from E and heading to the S.E. and a bark in sight to leeward at 6 P.M. took in 2 sail & shankers the latter part more moderate and got sail on heading S. wind E. S. E. so well & nothing to be seen Lat 29.49 S

Long 179.05 W.
