

Off the Navigator Island

Sunday June 27th 1852

Begins with fine weather the latter part the same and in water on liberty to make the 24 hours

Monday June 28th

Begins with a fine trade and pleasant weather and employed a gill net for sea

Tuesday June 29th

Begins with a calm and in fine a gill net and water 24 hours

Wednesday June 30th

Begins with fine weather and gill net for sea

Thursday July 1st

Begins with fine weather and a gill net for sea so ends the 24 hours

Friday July 2nd 1852

Begins with a fine trade and at 11 past 3 P.M. took our anchors for sea and at 4 past 6 discharged to Pilot and the crew of shore N.E. under short sail for the night the middle and latter part fine and heading in for the land in hope to find a whale so ends Lat 13.40 S Long 171.30 W

Saturday July 3rd

Begins with a light trade and running down the land the North of Upolu at 6 P.M. hauled to of shore and started sail for the night the latter part the crew of shore the North side of Upolu in hope to find a whale but saw nothing Lat 13.38 S Long 172.00 W

Off the Navigator Island

Sunday July 4th 1852

Begins with fine weather and running of down along the land and saw a sail to seaward of the land the middle and latter part of the day of down and no whale Lat 13.45 S Long 172.30 W

Monday July 5th

Begins with a fine trade and a heading in along the S.W. side of the island the middle and latter part squally and working up on the South side of Upolu so ends Lat 14.03 S Long 172.10 W

Tuesday July 6th

Begins with a strong trade from S.E. and heading in for the land and of Upolu at 4 past 6 the latter part heading in for the land and of it so ends the 24 hours Lat 14.00 S Long 172.00 W

Wednesday July 7th

Begins with a strong trade from the S.E. and heading in for the land and the latter part heading in for the weather part of the island so ends the 24 hours Lat 14.55 S Long 171.38 W

Thursday July 8th

Begins with a strong trade from the S.E. and heading in for the land at 6 P.M. took ship of and put the main sail for the night the latter part went on shore with two boats to trade for yams and so ends Lat 15.00 S Long 171.30 W

Friday July 9th

Begins with a trade wind from E. & two boats in a heading at 6 P.M. came of and got through at 11 past 6 made sail heading S.E. and heading for N. Red Sea S. Long & the crew of shore the middle and latter part a very strong trade and under double reef Lat 15.04 S Long 171.55 W
