

Homeward Bound
Friday July 30th

Begins with a Gale from E. N. E. and rain
and begins to headine S. E. at 2 P. M.
a heavy sea on and wind began to fall
at 4 made some sail with N. N. W. and
thereby S. E. the middle and latter part
wind from N. N. W. and fine all sail on
that will draw Lat 40.14 S. Long 154.48 W.

Saturday July 31st

Begins with wind weather even from
N. N. W. there by S. E. by S. and all sail
set at 9 had Mr. Stetson taken with a
bit of insanity and blood him. At 1 P. M.
Mr. Norton fainted and fell down on Deck
in his watch so two of duty the latter part
a light air from S. E. and so ended
with not much headway on heading N.
to the N. E. Lat 40.14 S. Long 154.02

Sunday Aug 1st 1852

Begins with a breeze from E and heading
S. E. and at 4 took in light sail
at 8 blowing on anchor drift down at 12 posted
Carried away the fore Mast and mast
came along side & posted main tack called all
hand to take sail in at 2. bore to under
close reef main topsail & 4 spindles at 4
took in M. Topsail & set M. Spindles and
it blowing very heavy from E heading
S. E. so ended with a very heavy sea on
& blowing a terrific Gale Lat 41.50 Long 153.50

Monday Aug 3rd

Begins with a very heavy gale from
E and began to headine S. E. and a broad part
sea on at 1 P. M. there the gangway board
at 4 P. M. we started 20 lbs of water
the middle and latter part the same and
laying plank down & great quantity
of heaving in to seaward

Lat 42.09 S. Long 154.20 W.

Homeward Bound
Tuesday August 3rd 1852

Begins with a very heavy gale from E and
begin to under 4th M. Spindles heading to
the South and a very heavy sea on the middle
and latter part the same Lat 42.30 S. Long 154.40

Wednesday Aug 4th

Begins with a very heavy gale from E and
begin to under 2 spindles and then the
state of, and a very heavy sea on the middle
and latter part the same Lat 42.50 S.

Long 154.50 W.

Thursday Aug 5th

Begins with a heavy gale from E. and
a very heavy sea on at 1 P. M. put the
Main Topsail on for fear of the sea heading
at 2 set fore topsail stay sail and
M. Spindles in at 11 blowing very heavy and
put the weather 1 half of M. Topsail
and the latter part the same wind
held to E. N. E. heading S. E. so ended and
a heavy sea on Lat 43.20 S. Long 155.00

Friday Aug 6th

Begins with a gale from E. N. E. and
a high sea on at 2 P. M. main moderate
& but the weather clear of M. Topsail
the weather thick and rainy & heading
S. E. the middle part set fore sail and
at 4 P. M. set 4th M. Spindles and then
of S. to keep out of the head sea and
it blowing strong at times from E. N. E.
and rain so ended Lat 43.50 S.
Longitude 155.37 W. Long 155.37 W.

Saturday Aug 7th

Begins with a gale from some sail on. Thereby
N. wind from E. N. E. and rainy and very
rough. The middle part moderate and made
sail at 3 P. M. blown on again and took in
all but double reef latter the same and
thick Lat 44.56 S. Long 155.40 W.
