

Ship Swift homeward bound
 Thursday Nov 18th 1852
 Begins with a light air from
 N. N. E. and steering N. W. and
 heading N. E. by E. at 4
 B. at 5 and wind N. E. by E.
 Sailing but stretching sails in
 2 sail in sight at 8 it began to
 blow on and soon taking in at 11
 running under main top sail on. For sail
 it blowing very heavy at 3 P. M.
 Left to to the North and at 7
 two sail in sight close by and the
 weather thick & heavy but soon
 moderate at 9 made sail and heading
 by the wind from N. W. to N. E. by E.
 sound. Lat by ste 38.25 N Long by Ch. 69.52

Friday Nov 19th
 Begins with a strong breeze from N. E.
 by N. and heading S. W. by S. sails double
 reefed at 8 wind held and came up
 N. by W. weather raising the middle part the
 same at 3 P. M. got bottom in 45 fathoms
 grey & white sand with shells at 8 got
 bottom in 35 fathoms at 9 spoke Schooner
 Cranbrook Fish of St. George 4 day from
 London. bound Virginia and down
 a boat & sent to her & in going along
 she the got Cepheid and 6. M. was got
 on board and two went aboard on the
 boat & came very near getting drowned
 & I had to take another boat after
 running for them some distance and got
 them safe and took the boat along
 side and sent a boat for the other
 at 11 past 8 got all on board and the
 weather very thick and blowing on at
 9 took in 2 reef down at 10 hour ship
 to the E wind N. N. E. dead a head and blowing
 hard. Lat 40.25 N Long 70.00 W

Ship Swift homeward bound
 Saturday Nov 20th 1852
 Begins with a gale from N. N. E. and heading
 E. under short sail at 4 P. M. wind held
 some and moderated so set 2nd top sails &
 mainsail heading E. N. E. wind N. and
 a head sea on the middle part heading
 up N. E. by N. latter part heading E. N. E.
 and blowing strong and saw 4 sail
 at 11 made on wave ship to the W. and
 so made this 24 hour. Lat by ste 39.40 N
 Long 74.40 W

Sunday Nov 21st 1852
 Begins with a strong breeze from N.
 heading N. N. W. under double reef.
 at 11 much as one can drag to, and the
 weather very squally & thick so latter
 for three days the middle part under
 was moderate and in 30 fathoms of water
 at 3 P. M. split the 4th top sail in turning out
 the reef and sent it down to mend at
 4 got it on again and all sail heading
 N. N. W. and a number of ships close to
 bound in to N York at 10 took ship
 to the Eastward at 11 made on. Spoke
 a New York Pilot Boat. & made fine
 weather and got a Lattack Lat 39.28 N
 Long 73.03 W

Monday Nov 22nd
 Begins with fine weather and wind
 from N heading E. N. E. with all sail
 but a head that sea on and wind a
 head the middle part wind held to N E
 and took ship to the N. W. and at
 3 P. M. Calm latter part wind from S. E.
 very light and steering N. N. E. and set
 stretching sails so with weather thick
 and Lat 39.50 N Long 75.20 W
 got bottom in 38 fathoms of water at
 7 P. M. grey & white sand
