 ship duty so end the day
 latitude 24.20 long 63.34

Sunday 8
 the day with strong ESE winds vessel sail
 under 4 hours heading E by E.
 so end the day
 latitude 25.33 long 63.54

Monday 9
 the day with winds from ESE. and
 vessel under all sails heading
 E by the winds saw 4 master
 Schooner going to the south so
 explaining in ship duty so end
 latitude 27.00 long 63.05

Tuesday 10
 the day with light winds and calm
 vessel under all sail heading E by E
 all explaining in ship duty so end
 latitude 28.18 long 62.16

Wednesday May 11 the 1910
 the day with light breeze and vessel
 under all sail 1 p.m. saw large
 with the water and saw the boat
 with donat. See nothing more
 came back so end
 latitude 28.50 long 61.54

Saturday 14
 the day with winds from SSE.
 and Squally vessel heading E by E.
 under mainsail and head sail,
 explaining baffling the whals
 No latitude long 59.25
