bailing the whals and stand down
same the oil saw one steamer
so end latitude 33.09 lang 53.52

and whals going with to render
and in 2 hours us with suit so
denat lower the heat down so end
latitude 33.30 lang 52.51

Thursday 2
the day with strong breeze from South
vessel under shot sail so end the day
latitude 33.37 lang 52.42

Friday 3
the day with strong breeze from
South and vessel under shot
sail enflaming ship duty so end
latitude 33.25 lang 53.22

Saturday 4
the day with strong breeze from South
and Sincuba so vessel heading to East
under shot sail so enflaming in
ship duty so end the day
latitude 33.50 lang 52.18
