 the day with winds from SW and at
 daylight, stood to cutting the whales and
 finished cutting 9 a.m. and stood
 the works saw brig veiola so end the
 day latitude 34.30 long 43.25

Thursday 18
 the day with storm breeze and squally
 vessel under sheet sails employing in
 hauling the whales brig veiola in
 sail so end the day latitude 34.40) 43.26

Friday 19
 the day with light breeze and fair sea
 and vessel under sheet sails and finished
 hauling and stowdown the oil saw
 brig veiola so end the day lat 34.44) 43.10

Saturday 20
 the day with winds from ESE and at
 daylight made all sail so to evening
 at sundown sheet sails so end the day
 latitude 34.36 long 43.04

Sunday 21
 the day with light breeze made all sail
 Spanish Bark wandered cutting the
 whales and Spanish brig veiola so
 end the day latitude 35.25) 43.14

Monday 22
 the day with calm and brig in sail
 and Bark so end the day
 latitude 35.43 long 43.25

Thursday August 23 the 1910
 the day with light winds from SW
 sent all sail heading SE by S. saw brig
 veiola so end the day latitude 35.25) 42.36.

Wednesday 24
 the day with winds from west and under
 all sail heading SE by S. and brig veiola
 in sail at 11.50 Raised 4 whales and 3
 boat and west boat went on and got
 fast and got stowse all to fair so.
 # bring them aboard and bill the whales
 bring long sail Reamend above in night
 and weather squally Reamne so end
 the day latitude 35.01, No long

Thursday 25
 the day stood to cutting the whales at
 at 2 p.m. got two. Cutting the whales and
 at 4 p.m. stood the works so all
 employing in duty so end the day
 latitude 35.06 No long

Friday 26
 the day with strong breeze from SE.
 vessel under sheet sails and employing
 hauling the whales so end the day
 latitude 35.07 long 40.45

Saturday 27
 the day with winds from ESE vessel
 under sheet sails employing in hauling
 the whales finished at 3 p.m. and
 stowdown saw the oil so end the day
 latitude 35.31 long 40.51
