 the day with winds from ESE and cloudy
 beat down the sails and furl the stand down
 the sail and saw one sail so end the day
 latitude 35.07 long 30.00

Monday 25
 the day with winds from ESE and squally
 and keen vessel under all sails beat
 saw one steamer going to westward
 so end the day latitude 35.16 long 30.00

Tuesday 26
 the day with light winds from ESE and
 vessel under all sail and put the stand down
 in west sea so end the day
 latitude 36.06 long 30.59

Wednesday 27
 the day with winds from south and vessel
 under all sails heading ESE so end
 the day latitude 36.36 long 31.50

Thursday September 1
 the day with strong breeze from south
 Cape Sea and vessel under sheet sail
 so end the day latitude 37.12 long 32.45

Friday 2
 the day with winds from SW blowing
 stern vessel under sheet sail
 so end the day etc etc

Saturday 3
 the day with calm and light winds from
 west vessel heading ESE and south so end
 the day latitude 37.51 long 32.53

Sunday September 4th 1910
 the day with winds from ESE and
 squally vessel under all sails
 so end the day latitude 38.00 long 31.25

Monday 5
 the day with calm light wind vessel
 under sheet sail light winds from ESE
 washed the vessel so end the day
 etc latitude long 30.55

Tuesday 6
 the day with winds from ESE and vessel
 heading seaward under all sails
 so end the day latitude 38.00 long 30.41

Wednesday 7
 the day with calm and saw Barb.
 hauling the mast so end
 the day latitude 38.02 long 30.38

Thursday 8
 the day with calm vessel under all sails
 saw Barb hauling so end the day
 latitude 38.00 long 30.15

Friday 9
 the day with light winds from west
 vessel under all sails heading ESE or
 one Barb in sail so end the day
 latitude 38.12 long 29.45

Sep 10 arrived in Fozal at 10.30 am
 men in play in ship duty finish
 marring at 5.30 pm so ends the
 this day
