This day begins with cloudy weather strong breeze from N.E. Toward under short sail first on one tack than the other one seen in sight men in play in ship's duty shorting sail at 4 pm reef fore sail so ends this day

Saturday June 9 This day begins with clear weather fresh breeze toward under all sail raised hales lower at 6 am got on edge of a long side 11 am cut in made fire at 6 pm nothing in sight so ends this day

Sunday June 10 This day begins with calm weather until 4 pm light breeze heading N.E. by N in play in hauling men in play in ship's duty finish at 8 pm Barge hauled in sight hauling so ends this day
Lat 36 08 Long 74 46

Sunday June 11 This day begins with cloudy weather and rain in play in hauling all toward under all sail gam barge hauled shasting sail at 7 pm men in play in ship's duty two steamers in sight so ends
Lat 36 18 Long 74 18

Monday June 12 This day begins with light fog toward under all sail staving N.E. hauled in sight men in play in ship's duty shorting sail at 7 pm wind from S.W. one four masts Sch in sight so ends
Lat 36 20 Long 74 22

Tuesday June 13 1911

This day begins with cloudy weather fog at 8 am toward under all sail staving to them N.E. men in play in ship's duty at 8 pm fresh breeze from S.W. hauled to under fore and main try sail heading W one steamer three masts Sch in sight so ends this day no lat Long 74 00

Wednesday June 14 This day begins with fair weather calm toward under short sail staving N.E. at 4 pm light breeze from south W.S. hauled to under fore and main try sail heading South men in play in ship's duty two fore masts Sch in sight so ends
Lat 36 55 Long 73 47

Thursday June 15 This day begins with clear weather toward under all sail staving to men in play in ship's duty at 6 pm gaming Sch seen a swift shorting sail at 7 pm heading N.W. under fore and main try sail so ends
Lat 36 35 Long 73 52

Friday June 16 This day begins with fair weather toward under all sail staving south saw whale with Ellen Swift sawer at 5 am Sch struck and lost it Swift boat stove on man lost hick up by the saw the whale cut in and hauled at 6 pm Toward above the one got a long side 10.30 pm so ends this day no sight

Saturday June 17 This day begins with clear weather in play in masting and hauling give man by one of the whales he refuse it hauled in sight men in play in ship's duty at 8 pm calm hauled to under fore and main try sail heading N.E. so ends this day
