

78 Thurs Jan 15 - 1914

Strong NE Trades. Set up 2 casks
Very heavy swell. Vessel making
about 2000 strokes in 24 hours
Pumps and lights attended to
So ends this day Lat $18^{\circ}08' N$
Long $26^{\circ}38' W$

79 Friday Jan 16 - 1914

Very Strong NE Trades. Trying
to get under the lee of St. Antoine
Pumps and lights attended to
So ends this day Lat $17^{\circ}45' N$
Long $25^{\circ}42' W$

80 Sat Jan 17 - 1914

Vessel under the lee of St. Antoine.
Ratified the waltham Chron
Found it to be gaining 2 sec
Per day. Error today is $4^m 38^s$ fast
Set up 3 casks So ends this day

81 Sunday Jan 18 - 1914

Vessel under the lee of St. Antoine
Captain started for the shore
With the W Boat and a crew of
six men to post letters
Pumps and lights attended to
So ends this day

82 Monday Jan 19 - 14

Begins with a calm vessel lying to under
the lee of St. Antoine. Capt. came on board at
2 P.M. with the boat crew and reported
that in trying to land the boat got broad
side to the surf and was capsized and one
man was drowned and the body carried out
to sea and was not recovered although
diligent search was made for it. The man's
name was Antoine J. Gomez. A native of
C.V.S. Aged 27 years. The boat was badly
stoven and left on the beach to be repaired
there by people there. Signed

83 Tuesday Jan 20 - 14

Begins with light air from W
about 10 A.M. took the wind from NE
Vessel heading out to sea on the
Northern tack. Later part Strong
NE breeze vessel making 2000 strokes
in 24 hours So ends this day

84 Wed Jan 21 - 14

Strong NE Trades Weather thick
and cloudy Steering by the wind
on Starboard tack Pumps and
lights attended to So ends this day
No Obs
