lights attended to. So ends this day

Tuesday May 12-14

Moderate N.E. trade. Clear and
pleasant. Boiling. Pumps and
lights attended to. So ends
Lat. $27^{\circ}10'$ N
Long. $73^{\circ}32'$ W.

Wed May 13-14

Moderate S.E. breeze and cloudy.
Finished stowing down 45
bbls of oil. Leak increasing.
So ends this day
Lat. $26^{\circ}50'$ N
Long. $75^{\circ}02'$ W.

Thursday May 14-14

Light S.E. breeze and cloudy.
Pumps and lights attended to.
So ends this day
Lat. $27^{\circ}40'$ N
Long. $76^{\circ}39'$ W.

Friday May 15-1914

Begins with South wind and very thick
and overcast. At 9 A.M. it began to
rain very hard and continued to rain
until 7 P.M. Later part cloudy.
Pumps and lights attended to.
Steward sick with fever but not off duty.
Manuel Anchoa same. No Obse.

Sat May 16-1914

Light N.E. trade. Weather clear and
pleasant. Pumps and lights attended to.
So ends this day Lat. $27^{\circ}50'$ N
Long. $77^{\circ}45'$ W.

Sunday May 17-14

Very light N.E. trade.
Pumps and lights attended to.
So ends this day Lat. $27^{\circ}34'$ N
Long. $78^{\circ}34'$ W.

Monday May 18-14

Easterly wind and squally.
Pumping every 2 hours. It takes about
6 minutes to free the pumps.
Benjamin ^{Steward} Forté. Manuel Anchoa ^{Boat stoker}
John Alver. Robert Oliveira. Jose Martine.
Have the fever also John Alver.
They do not have it every day.
When they have no fever they are around
decks. When the fever comes on they
are off duty. So ends this day

Long. $78^{\circ}30'$ W.
