Begins with a calm. Later part very light Southerly air Sick men about the same

All on duty except W. Spanner.

Friday May 29

Very light air from west with thick hazy weather. Vessel leaking about the same. It takes 2 hours in 24 to keep the vessel dry with one good pump. Sick men about the same. So ends

Long $74^{\circ}30' W$

Sat May 30-

Very light air from the northward Nothing in sight - Leak the same No Obs

Sunday May 31-1914

Calm the whole 24 hours

Leak the same So ends this day

Lat $31^{\circ}26' N$
Long $73^{\circ}38' W$

Monday June 1

Very light air and calm. What little air there is comes from the westward. The three Sick men are about the same. Leak not growing any less. Nothing in sight - So ends this day

Lat $31^{\circ}36' N$
Long $72^{\circ}40'12' W$

Tuesday June 2

Moderate S.W. breeze with hazy weather Caught several Dolphin

Pumps and lights attended to So ends this day Lat $32^{\circ}48' N$
Long $72^{\circ}12' W$

Wed June 3-

Moderate N.E. breeze. Steering N.W. for Hatarase ground. Sick men about the same. Leak the same

Lat $33^{\circ}21' N$
Long $72^{\circ}58' W$
