

Wednesday June 10 - 1914

Calm all day Saw two Leboners
W. Spunner & J. Martin are im-
proving slowly. But are not
yet able to work. Vessel leaking
quite bad. Pump every 2 hours.
It takes about ten minutes each
time. So ended this day Lat. $36^{\circ}25'$
Long $74^{\circ}14'$

Thursday June 11

Moderate S.W. breeze. Several
thunder showers during the day.
Vessel cruising. So ended this day
Lat. $36^{\circ}45'$ N
Long $73^{\circ}48'$ W

Fri June 12 - 14

Moderate S.W. breeze in the morning
thunder storm at 10 a.m. Good
S.W. breeze in the afternoon
Vessel cruising weather thick
and hazy Lat. $37^{\circ}15'$ N
Long $73^{\circ}19'$ W

Sat. June 13

Begins with a calm. Sperm whales
were raised at 6 a.m. by
Albert - Oliveira. Lowered three
boats. Whaler going to quick
no chance to strike. Landed
the Lebrs W.A. Graber & J.R. Martin
Sick men much better
Pumps & lights attended to

Lat. $37^{\circ}40'$ N
Long $73^{\circ}20'$ W

Sunday June 14 - 1914

Light N.E. breeze all day Vessel cruising &
Whalers in sight. Spoke the 4 masted schooner
Dean. E. Brown. Pumps and lights attended
to So ended this day Lat. $37^{\circ}20'$ N
Long $73^{\circ}25'$ W

Monday June 15

Calm all day four whalers in sight.
So ended this day Lat. $37^{\circ}12'$ N
Long $74^{\circ}00'$ W

Tues June 16

Begins with a light N.W. breeze and
cloudy at 8 a.m. wind began to blow
hard and so continued till 5 P.M.
when it began to moderate. Vessel
cruising William Spunner returned to
duty. Pumps and lights attended to
So ended this day Lat. $37^{\circ}15'$ N
Long $73^{\circ}49'$ W

Wed June 17

Light Easterly breeze. Sperm whales
were raised at 9 a.m. by Mr Gilbert.
Lowered 3 boats. Third mate caught
one. Whaler after one boat got fast
went quick to windward

Lat. $36^{\circ}34'$
Long $74^{\circ}19'$
