

Thursday June 18-1914

Sperm whales seen with frequent of wind and rain. Sperm whales were raised at 1 P.M. by Mr Gilbert. Lowered three boats. WB & SB each caught one. Got the last one along side at dark. Took in sail and made the whaler fast for the night. Pumps and lights attended to.

Friday June 19

Light SE breeze with plenty of rain. Finished cutting in at 10 A.M. Later part clear and pleasant with very light SW breeze. Pumps and lights attended to.

Sat June 20

Good breeze from the north with thick hazy weather. Vessel Cruising. Finished boiling at 1 P.M. Saw two Whalers boiling.

Pumps and lights attended to.

Sunday June 22-1914

Begins with light westerly breeze with thick cloudy weather. Later part very moderate until 7 P.M. when a very heavy squall from NW came on. No damage done. Vessel under bare poles. At 10 P.M. Calm. Pumps and lights attended to. So ends this day.

Tuesday June 23

Thick Cloudy rainy weather with frequent squalls from all directions. Pumps and lights attended to.

Wednesday June 24

Sperm whales were raised at 6 A.M. No wind at all. Lowered 3 boats at once. No chance to get fast. Boats came on board at 7 A.M. Lowered again at 8:30. Each boat caught one. Got the last one along side at 1 P.M. Finished cutting in at 7 P.M. Later part calm. Commenced boiling at 10 P.M. Pumps and lights attended to. J. Martin on duty. all well. So ends this day.
